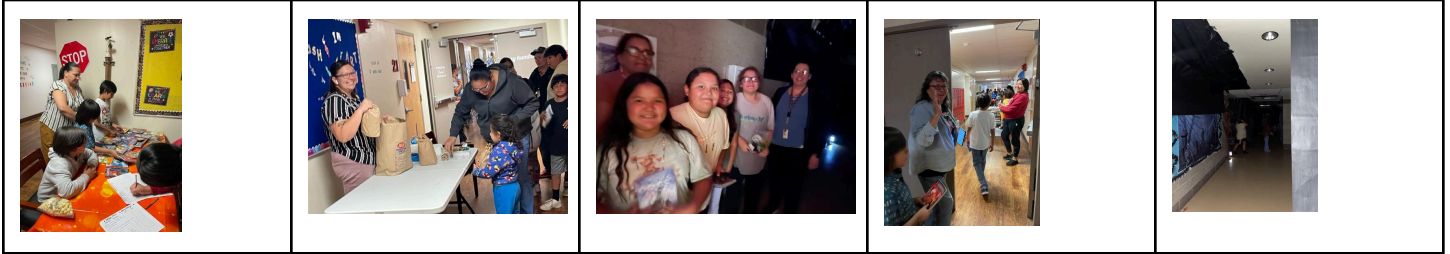
Staff Wellness Day

During the month of October we had a full agenda of many items that needed to be met before our MAST testing. We started by doing a PD with our homeroom teachers on implementing ORF and NCF-T goal setting as well as implementing our small group for math.

Although we took part in several activities such as Homecoming parade, Red ribbon, the District writing assessment and Halloween/Fun Day we kept our focus on instruction without skipping a beat.

We have completed our first Fall Benchmark testing with about 95% of our students tested! We have also completed our first district writing assessment with the help of our 5th grade teachers scoring our 4th graders papers.

We hosted a bat making arts and craft during our fun Friday and both the students and coaches had a blast.

We continue to actively work in classrooms modeling for our new staff and provide support as needed. The coaches both have at least 2 active coaching cycles at this time.
