 » Currently, the Bilingual Emergent Spanish-Speaking ELs whose parents accept the Dual Language (DL) program attend Hodge Elementary.





Propose to Expand the PreK & K DL Program Access in the BHS Zone

Why? DL programs are important in laying a strong foundation for emergent bilingual students from early childhood through grade 5 and secondary programs.

Identify One Elementary Campus to Provide a PreK & K DL Program

- » 24+ incoming Kinder and PreK ELs will be given the option to participate in a DL classroom in the BHS zone
- » Expand the DL program by one grade level each subsequent year.
- » Incoming DL students in grades 1-5 will continue to attend Hodge due to the number of DL currently at the campus.

Next Steps to Expand the Dual Language Program in the BHS Zone



- Approve funding for 2 PreK & K teacher salaries and instructional materials
 - Salary for bilingual paraprofessional
 - Plan on providing bilingual DLL, dyslexia, and teacher support services
- Identify BHS Zone Dual Language Campus
 - Provide campus professional development and virtual parent meetings
- Provide parent & community communication on the importance and benefits of dual language programs
 - Virtual Parent Meetings in the BHS Zone
- Support campuses in the online registration for PreK and newly enrolled campuses to facilitate the English Learner identification process

Future Expansion of the Dual Language Program in the GHS Zone & Secondary Campuses

- » GHS DL Program
 - PreK DL Program
 - Expansion to provide DL program closer to Adkins, Blanton, & EP Rayzor
- » DL Expansion at the Secondary Campuses
 - Currently at Calhoun, Strickland, & Myers DL Program
 - DL MS at the GHS Zone
 - Pathway to DL courses at DHS, RHS, & GHS
