## **Purpose:**

- 1. Provide a valuable framework of standard requirements for students who are 4yr college/university bound.
- 2. Offer an incentive for students to take challenging courses throughout their high school tenure.
- 3. Reward students who challenge themselves academically.
- 4. Provide students distinction when applying for college admittance and scholarships.

## **Credit Requirements:**

Language Arts 4 credits (1 credit must be an advanced/honors/college level class)

Mathematics\* 3 credits (must include Algebra II)

Science\* 3 credits (must include a lab science such as physics, chemistry, Adv Bio, etc)

Social Sciences\* 3 credits

Foreign Language\* 2 credits in the same language

Health 1 credit
PE 1 credit
Career Ed 1 credit

Advanced Course 1 honors/adv. credit beyond the above noted minimum in a field marked (\*)

Technology Ed 1 credit (PTE/Business/Ag Science/Computer Education)

<u>Elective Credits</u> 6 credits Total Req. Credits 26 credits

### **GPA Requirements:**

Minimum GPA 3.25 (through 06/07)

Minimum GPA 3.50 (after 06/07) or a 3.25GPA or better with an 1100 SAT (or equivalent) or 23 ACT score.

### **Other Requirements:**

Students must earn a state issued CIM (reading, writing, mathematics, and science).

No D or F on transcript.

Additional requirements as per Policy IKF-Standard (i.e. Educational Plan & Profile, Extended Application, Career-Related Learning and Learning Experiences)

### **Implementation and Guidance:**

The Honors Diploma may be awarded as soon as graduation 2006 at Riverside Jr/Sr High School and Heppner Jr/Sr High School and in graduation 2007 at Irrigon Jr/Sr High School.

Honors Diploma criteria will be published in all jr/sr high school student handbooks and other pertinent school materials.

Students interested in attaining an Honors Diploma must begin planning with their guidance counselors, class advisors, and parent(s)/guardian(s) early on in their high school careers to insure GPA and credit requirements are being met.
