Geneva CUSD 304 Draft Goals for 2016-2017

District Goal = Develop a learning environment that empowers our students and educators as they become:

- self-directed, life-long learners;
- effective communicators;
- complex, creative, & adaptive thinkers;
- and collaborative & productive citizens.

Action Statements/Benchmarks

- Develop, implement, and refine an elementary writing scope and sequence (including new writing assessment descriptors on the elementary progress report for all trimesters).
- Fully implement and refine the new STEMScopes resource at the middle school level. Continue a 'deep dive' into the NGSS with a fully-formed elementary science committee with the goal of developing a comprehensive implementation plan (complete with recommended resources) for the elementary level.
- Implement a blended health course while investigating and developing additional blended-learning opportunities for the high school level.
- Increase individualized student access to technology through the expanded deployment of devices. The 2016-17 school year will include individualized access for students in grades 3 – 7 and 9 – 10 as well as classroom sets for grades K-2.
- Utilize technology as a platform to support the organization, access, and use of Geneva CUSD 304 data.
- Support GHS leadership in the development of a student-based technology support program where students develop and use technical skills to support staff and students.
- Extend CHAMPS training/coaching at MCS and HSS. All K-3 teachers will implement the CHAMPS approach in their classrooms.
- Review needs at the early childhood level related to programming and space.
- Create a program at GHS to further address the needs of at-risk students.
- Continue to refine RtI/MTSS processes at the elementary level.
- Provide opportunities for teachers to collaborate on assessment creation and reflection.
- Increase the use of common assessments throughout the district.
- Make the incorporation of student growth data both meaningful and manageable for teachers and evaluators.
- Review and adjust our plan for payment of long term debt through efficiencies, by refunding callable bonds, and taking advantage of current interest rates.
- Plan our budget to support professional development and supply the tools necessary to help our students be successful while also protecting resources from the uncertainty of Illinois funding.

- Maintain schools and contain costs through preventative maintenance.
- Develop comprehensive facility plans that maximize the learning environment for each building.
- Review current transportation processes for efficiencies especially in the area with an emphasis on Special Education Transportation.

2015-16 Board goals determined through the work of our Communication Task Force (The Communication Task Force will be discussing these at their meeting at 3:00 this coming Monday, July 25th, and should bring an update to the entire Board that evening.) :

1) The Board will establish a focused plan for engaging community members in a two way communication process to inform decision making and further enhance transparency.

2) The Board will continuously monitor District performance through presentations at Board meetings throughout the year, enhance the District website data dashboard, and present reports to the public in a visually straightforward format.

3) The Board will identify ways to enhance and update policies and policy guidelines through input, discussion, and possible approval of recommendations from the administration and the Policy Committee.
