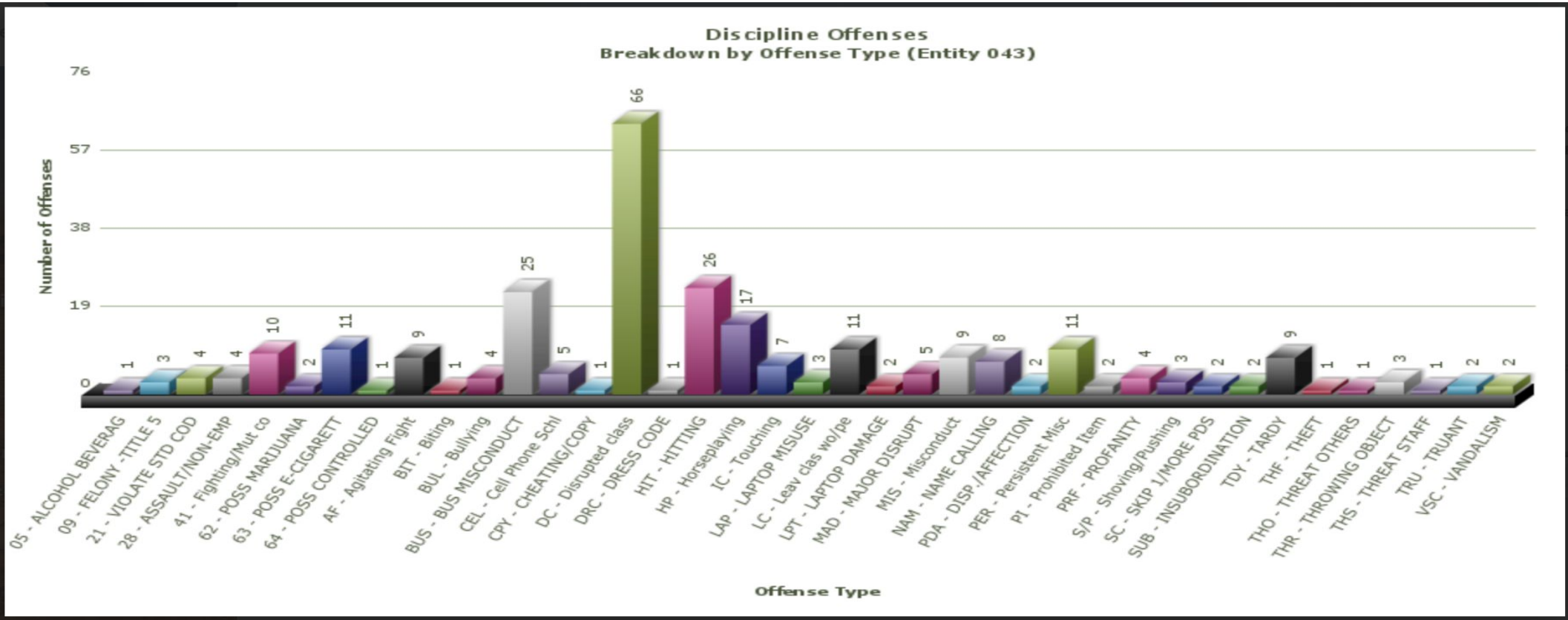

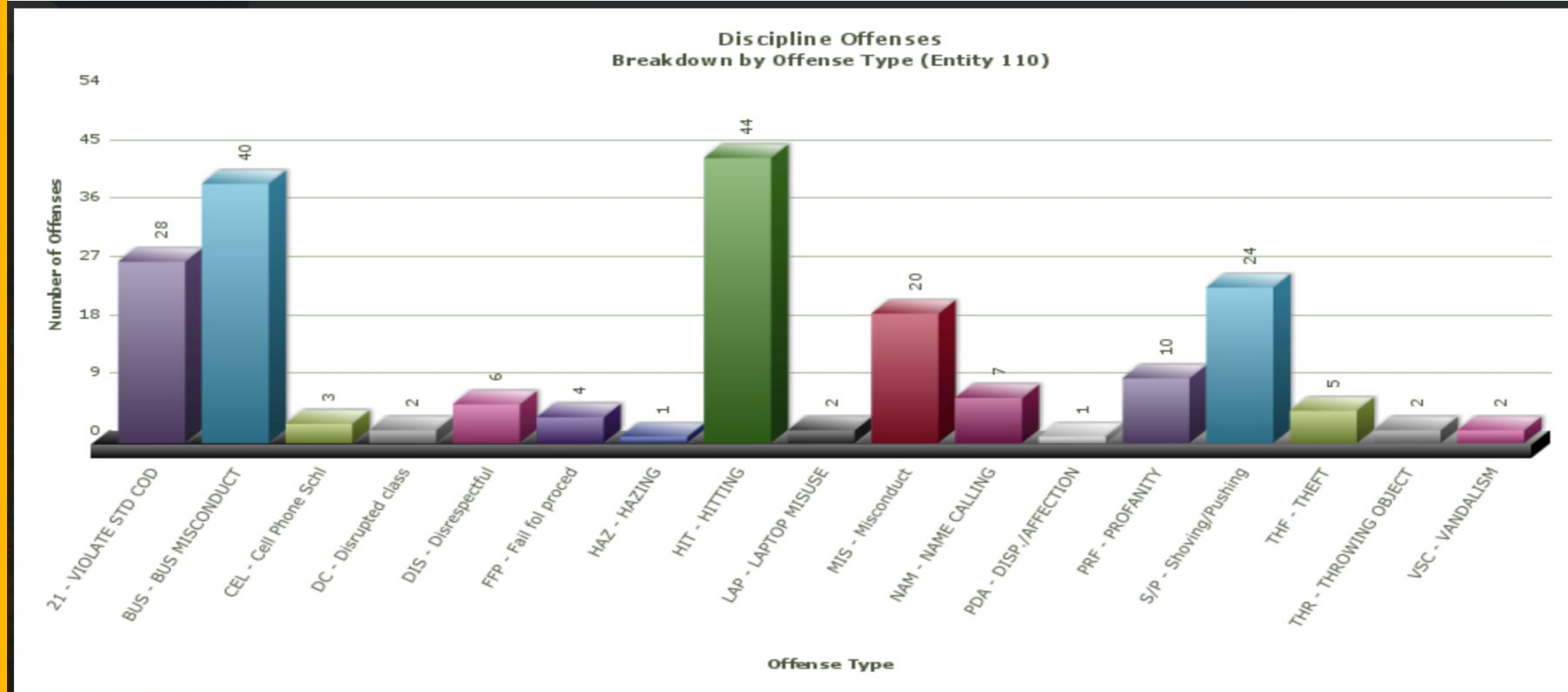

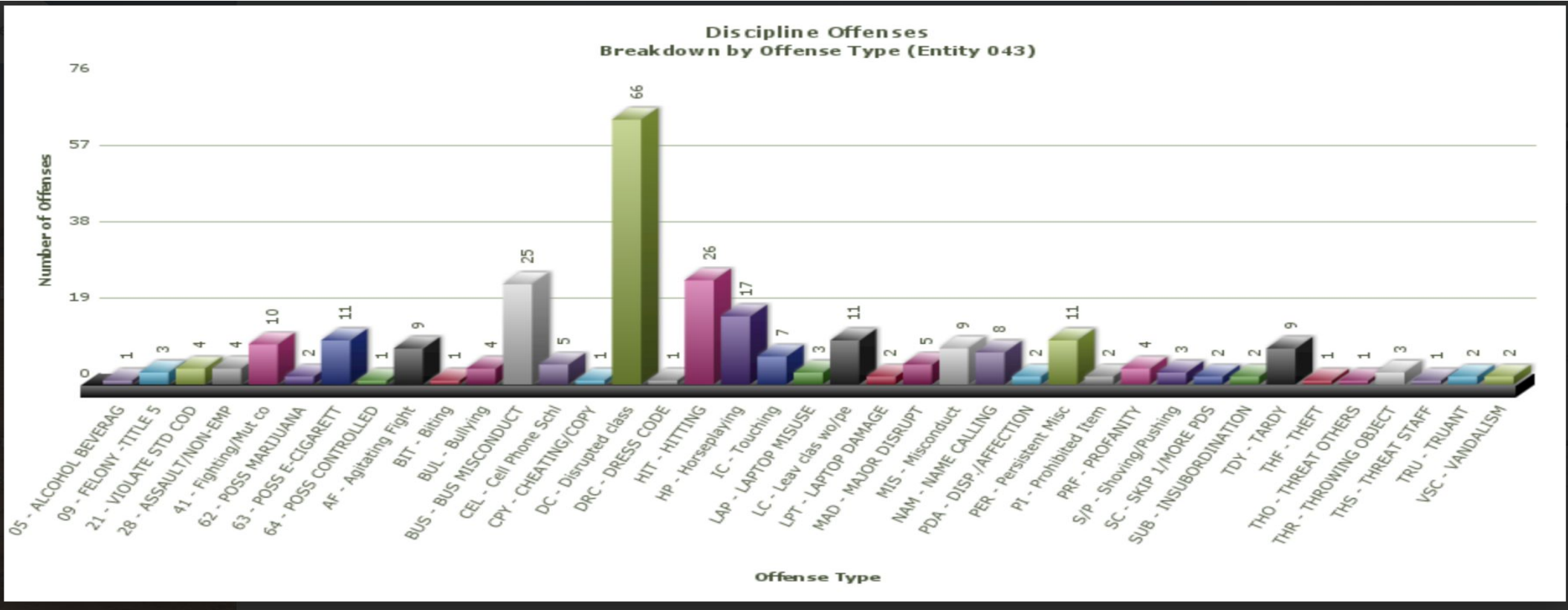

Districtwide Summary

Discipline trends across Snyder ISD behavior:

- Early grades: Students are still learning how to manage their behavior, so we see more hands-on issues and basic misconduct.
- Middle grades: Behaviors shift toward more classroom disruption and increased conflict between peers.
- High school: Challenges are more about engagement, following expectations, and staying on track with procedures.



MTSS

Snyder ISD has been working closely with Region 14 alongside a group of teachers and administrators to develop our MTSS framework.
