2026 Facilities

Assessment Committee:

Information:

Senate Bill 11:

The Board will review two options in response to Senate Bill 11, codified in Texas Education Code § 25.0823, which requires each board of trustees to take a recorded vote on whether to adopt a policy providing a daily period of prayer and reading of religious texts.

One option would adopt a daily, voluntary prayer period outside instructional time with safeguards to protect student and employee choice, prevent coercion, and maintain district neutrality. The second option would decline to adopt the statutory prayer period while affirming that student and employee religious expression remains protected under existing law and district policy.

This item is presented to support Board understanding of statutory requirements and available options prior to the required record vote.

Compensation Plan Update: Current compensation for bus drivers is structured at \$30 per hour for route travel and \$15 per hour for field trips. In February, we will be recommending a revision to the compensation plan to establish a uniform hourly rate of \$30 for all bus driver work, including both route travel and field trips, to improve equity, recruitment, and retention.

Campus School Resource Officers:

Snyder ISD, in partnership with the Snyder Police Department, currently it has three School Resource Officers (SROs) serving the district. To enhance campus safety and align with HB3 requirements, the district will propose in February increasing to four SROs for the 2026-2027 school year. This will make Snyder ISD fully compliant with HB3 and eliminate the need for a yearly good cause exemption.
