Athletic Department End of Season Report – Spring 2025

Spring Season Report: Highlights & Overview

This report provides a comprehensive look at our spring sports season, detailing participation numbers, program costs, academic achievements, and the various clubs and activities offered.

We're pleased to report that athletic participation remained strong, mirroring last spring's numbers with **430 student-athletes** involved. Operating expenses for the programs were also consistent with previous seasons.

Academically, our student-athletes truly excelled. A remarkable **132** (63%) varsity student-athletes earned All-Academic recognition for achieving a GPA of 87.5 or higher during the third marking period. Our top scholar-athletes for the spring season included Unified freshman Isaac Torres with a perfect 100 GPA, Junior Crew student-athlete Leah McMullen with a 98.71 GPA, and Junior Girls Tennis student-athlete Mackenzie La with a 98.67 GPA.

Beyond academics, our athletes also achieved significant athletic recognition. **Twenty-nine varsity student-athletes** were selected for the All-CCC South Conference team. Furthermore, **14 student-athletes** committed to continuing their athletic careers at the collegiate level.

The Jim Bransfield Legacy Award was created to honor Jim Bransfield and all he did for our community and our student-athletes. This award is awarded to the "12 season student athlete." This years recipients are:

High School Sports Narratives

High School Softball: Scott Strang/Rachel Lemke

The MHS Softball team finished with 2 wins and 18 losses, with a very challenging Tier 1 CCC schedule and 3 high ranked non-conference opponents. The girls competed well all year, with just 3 losses by mercy, and 6 losses by just 1 or 2 runs. We had 3 players with multiple home run seasons. Two of our players, sophomore Kyleigh Franklin and Senior Abby Young were awarded all CCC Conference honors, and Franklin was selected to play in the state Sophomore All-Star game. Our starting pitcher and half-time catcher this season were both Freshmen, with lots of growth potential next year.

High School Baseball: Daniel Botti

MHS Baseball had a rebuilding year. We finished the season 1-19 and are looking forward to increasing our participation next year.

High School Girls Tennis: Kelvin Jones

The Middletown Girls Tennis Team finished the 2025 regular season with a 14-2 record and qualified for the State Tournament 2 years in a row. We finished the season ranked 3rd in Class L. With several key players returning for the 2026 season, Middletown should remain high in the CCC and CIAC standings. With the younger players stepping up and gaining experience, it will be a great addition to the program in the spring of 2026. With their commitment and dedication on the uprise, this program will continue to grow.

MHS Boys Tennis: Tish Ehnot

We fielded a boys Varsity Tennis team after a two year absence in the Ciac. Most pre season work was recruiting boys to play and we ended up with 12 to start the season. All but 2 had previous Varsity experience the rest were very new beginners to the sport and new to being on a sports team . Teaching the boys the fundamentals of the game to prepare them for Varsity competition was my priority. Although we didn't win a match the team improved every match and had a positive experience on the team. (One side note was our #1 singles player who would have had success and chances to compete individually post season had a death in the family and left the country and did not return)

High School Boys Outdoor Track & Field: Jenn Price

The boys Track and Field team had an excellent season. With more student/athletes signed up than ever before, all of the depth really played a positive role on the outcome of the season. Finishing the dual meet season at 7-0, we went into the CCC championship meet well positioned. Once the final scores were tallied, we ended up in a tie with Southington for the division championship. We also sent a large group of competitors to the Class L meet and had three individual athletes earn medals. We are looking forward to continuing this positive growth in future seasons.

High School Girls Outdoor Track & Field: James White

The girls' outdoor season has shown improvement, with a record of two wins, four losses, and one tie. The freshman class made significant contributions to dual meet scoring, and a great number competed in the conference. Top freshman scorers included Brookelyn Grant, Clea Reid, and Ayla Richter. The throwing squad performed exceptionally well, consistently scoring in dual meets and performing strongly in the conference. Consistent scoring was provided by Tamia Collins, Christiana Santana-Julia, and Kaylee Brasile(a multi-athlete) who also achieved a 4th-place finish in javelin overall in the CCC. Rose Farnsworth is another key athlete, consistently scoring in distance events and performing well in the conference. The incoming class shows promising upcoming season

High School Boys Golf: Matthew Harris

This season started off with some rain causing some scheduling changes and indoor practice. The boys golf team had 8 participants, 2 freshman, 1 junior, and 5 seniors. Coach Frost was the assistant coach, providing the team with individual skill and course management coaching. We played and practiced at Lyman Orchard Golf Course. They were very accommodating and made the season go as smoothly as possible. The boys golf team finished with an overall record of 7-4 and 7-3 in conference. The Blue Dragons participated in the 2025 CIAC Spring Classic tournament. As a team we finished 9th out of 10 teams. Andrew Dunn, medalist tie for 1st as an individual shooting a 36. Middletown finished 6th in the CCC Championship. Andrew Dunn finished 6th as an individual and was named All-Conference. The State Championship was held at Keney Golf Course. We did not qualify as a team but were able to send Andrew Dunn as an individual. He won the state championship. Medalist tie shooting -4 (66) This performance earned him a position at the state open and he was awarded All-State. The 2025 CIAC State Open was held at Mohegan Sun Golf Club. Andrew finished 21st out of a field of 32 golfers. 6 players on the team were all academic

High School Girls Golf: Roberta Downer

The MHS Girls Golf team finished the season with a record of 4-8. The 2025 season marked the inaugural year of the girls' golf co-op between Middletown High School and Cromwell Public Schools. With a team of three dedicated athletes — two from Middletown and one from Cromwell — we proudly competed in twelve matches throughout the season. The team showed consistent growth and sportsmanship, and we're thrilled to celebrate two individual honors: one player earned All-Conference recognition, and another was named to the All-Academic Team. This first season laid a strong foundation, and we look forward to building on that success in the years ahead.

High School Ultimate Frisbee: Trevor Charles

Ultimate frisbee had a phenomenal season this year despite many games being canceled due to weather across the state. The team finished 16-1, winning the state title, and going on to win the regional B division championship at PVI. The team was ranked 34th in the country at the end of the season.

High School Boys Lacrosse: Weventz Valery

The Middletown Boys lacrosse team had a 6-10 varsity season. We were 1 game shy of qualifying for the CT State post season playoffs. We had a very young team only graduating 2 seniors, with everyone else returning next year. We've had an amazing journey this season full of learning and development. I am truly confident that the team will be very successful in 2026.

High School Girls Lacrosse: Shannon Murdock

The girls lacrosse team finished the season 6-10 and made it to the CCC Central Division Playoffs. We were one win away from making it into the states tournament. We have continued to have a successful co-op with Coginchaug high school, and had more girls on the team this year than we have had since Covid. We look forward to thriving in the upcoming season with 11 rostered Seniors.

High School Spring Crew: Scot Peaslee

The MHS Crew team had a great spring season. We raced more competitive teams within our New England Conference, and medaled in 7 out of 8 boats entered in the Connecticut Public School Rowing Association Championships. We ended the season winning the Erica Cup at the Emerson Regatta at Harbor Park.

High School Unified Track: Cindy Culp

This season we started off with a cornhole invitational at Rocky Hill High School where we competed against 4 other teams. We made it to the finals where our team made up of Caleb Hayes and Link Geoffrey won the championship defeating East Windsor High by one point. Soon after we moved on to practicing for our flag football combine at Rocky Hill High school where we learned new drills and played 4 games against 3 different high schools. We won 3 out of the 4 games. Needless to say these students worked really hard this season, and we could not be any prouder of their accomplishments.
