Jacob earned the prestigious Brockman Scholarship!

The Brockman Scholarship is a merit-based full scholarship that covers five years of study at Texas A&M University in College Station, Texas.

The scholarship supports four years of undergraduate studies in an approved program of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics), as well as the one-year MS Business graduate degree program at Texas A&M's Mays Business School.

The Brockman scholars Program supports well-rounded individuals of character through merit-based scholarships purposefully designed to enable and encourage academic success, civic leadership and contributions by scholarship recipients.

The Brockman Scholarship is awarded to outstanding students who have merited the award primarily through their academic achievements, as well as their good character, high levels of constructive community engagement and their qualities as good citizens.

The Brockman scholarship covers tuition fees in full, (regardless of whether a scholarship recipient normally resides in-state (Texas) or out-of-state), room and board, transportation, books and supplies, and one overseas study opportunity.

Brockman Scholars are expected to demonstrate high achievement in an academically rigorous environment, campus and community engagement, and a significant commitment to leadership.

The philanthropic activities of the Brockman Foundation are made possible by a trust established by A. Eugene Brockman. The late Mr. Brockman, a businessman and philanthropist, believed strongly that gifted individuals could help to create a better world for us all. His vision is at the core of what the Foundation believes in , and supports.

To be considered, a student must:

- Be a US citizen and graduate of an accredited US high school.
- Have a minimum composite SAT score of 1400 or ACT score of 32.
- Be under 21 years of age at the date of application for the scholarship and must not have previously been a full-time university/college student.
- Have applied to an approved program of study at Texas A&M University and met admissions requirements to enroll as an incoming freshman after high school graduation;
- Pursue a major in science, technology, engineering or math (STEM) and plan to complete a one-year Masters' of Science in Business at Texas A&M's Mays Business School.

The selection process for the Brockman Scholarship has three stages. The first stage is based on the information provide on a candidate's application form and in their supporting documentation. All complete applications will be reviewed.
