RE: Buffalo High School 2008-2009 Winter Activities Report

Buffalo High School has completed its winter activities season for 2008-2009. This report includes a narrative summary for each winter activity. Once again coaches and advisors have submitted season summaries for your review. The report also includes a detailed statistical summary of participation including coaching/advisor ratios.

This past year the board and administration have spent a great deal of time trying to make sense of financial shortfalls in our district and how they may affect BHS Activities. I want to thank you personally, professionally, and on behalf of our district for the effort you have made in tackling the tough issues. I know you have sifted through a lot of complicated information.

WINTER ACTIVITIES SUMMARIES:

BOYS HOCKEY: Coach Mike MacMillan – (14 years head coach, 16 in program)
Our season began with Buffalo hosting our Annual Varsity and J.V. Scrimmage Fest we had the following teams participate at the Buffalo Civic Center the first weekend of the season (Wayzata, Hopkins, Chaska, Blaine, Crookston, Rosemount, Edina, Maple Grove, St. Cloud Tech and Benilde-St.Margaret.). Other scrimmages this year included Eden Prairie, Duluth Denfield, and Duluth East.

For the nine straight years we faced a very tough non-conference schedule with the goal in mind to improve and get ready for section playoffs. This season we finished with a 15-12 record. This year we faced a number of teams that competed in their respective section finals and four state tournament AA teams. We continue to develop a relationship with Classic Lake and other top 15 programs to help develop tradition with in our program and bring up the level of competition.

Our season was highlighted by the third M8 championship in four years. Two other highlights of the season were our third game on FSN-North against Wayzata and our trip to Duluth which included an opportunity to skate in the new Heritage Center and pond hockey at the Buffalo House. Our community of Buffalo was very supportive again and excited to be featured on FSN-North.

In the Mississippi 8 we finished first, at 10-1 playing two rounds. Our J.V. team was able to compile a 12-11-1 record. They like the varsity played the same scrimmage schedule as well as a game schedule, except played one less game due to BBL not having a J.V. team.

In section play in Section 8 this year like last featured state powers, Moorhead and Roseau. We were seated 4th faced Brainerd in the quarterfinals. We defeated Brainerd at home 6 - 2 on to face number one seed Moorhead. We ended up losing the game 0-4 in a hard fought battle; Moorhead went on to place second at this year's state tournament.

Players successes this season were many, we put 6 players on first team all conference, 1 on second team. In the senior class we had our second biggest class in 14 years, with 10 seniors.

GIRLS HOCKEY: Coach Ray Dahlof—(3 years)

The Bison Girls' Hockey team finished the season with an overall record of 15-11. The most victories in Bison Girls' hockey history. In the Mississippi 8 conference, their record was 11-3 good for a 2nd place tie, one point out of first place. Three players made the all-conference team, senior Allison Malecek, junior Hannah Campion and sophomore Haley Morningstar. The Bison were seeded 6th in section 6AA and lost to #3 seed Benilde-St. Margaret's. The JV team had their 3rd straight undefeated conference season and finished with a 20-5 overall record. Senior captains Allison Malecek and Rachel Briant are the only seniors the Bison will lose. Senior Allison Malecek received the teams Hobey Baker character award and was also named to play in the high school girls' senior classic all-star game. The Bison team is made up of players from Buffalo, Delano, Howard Lake- Waverly- Winsted and Rockford high schools.

BOYS BASKETBALL: Coach Nick Guida— (6 years head coach, 12 in program)

The 2008-09 season started with mixed reviews. Looking at our schedule, I knew it might be a rough start record wise for the team. Playing top teams from class AAAA gives you the opportunity to see what it takes to beat the best. Our record going into winter break was 2-4. We beat 2 very solid teams to start the season. Our next 4 games we hit a skid losing 2 at the buzzer and having 2 more fairly close ones. During this time we gave up an average of 68 ppg defensively.

During the winter break we refocused on who we are and what it means to play basketball in Buffalo. This is when we committed to playing great “team” defense and continuing to share the ball on the offensive end. From then on we progressed into one of the best basketball teams in the history of Buffalo posting a 23-6 record. Within that record we went 16-0 winning our 3rd consecutive conference championship. As stated earlier, a key was great “team” defense. After Jan 1, we held teams to 45.6 ppg. This combined with our first 6 games we averaged 50.3 ppg defensively. This was good for 2nd amongst class AAAA schools. As a team, we are very proud of this accomplishment. Some highlights to the season were having the opportunity to play against top 10 competition in Minnesota. Osseo, Cooper, Tech, Monticello, STMA, and Champlin Park were all ranked in the top of their classes when we played them. This is a tremendous opportunity for our kids! In most games we either won or held our own.

Our season ended in the section 8AAAA title game against the #3 ranked Tech Tigers. It was a great high school basketball game with an outstanding environment. The community of Buffalo did a wonderful job supporting us and we gave them a great game. Tech hit a 3 pt basket with 2.5 seconds left that gave them a 1 pt lead. We ran a play and had an excellent opportunity to score but came up just short.

This last game says goodbye to 6 seniors who have a legacy to be proud of. Erik Olson, Brooks Beilke, Dan Ngandali, Kaleb Stevens, Brock Korbek, and Brady Matzke worked to their potential and beyond on a daily basis. They will be remember for their outstanding “team attitude” and effort.

With a record of 23-6 and another Mississippi8 conference championship, this group of young men will go down in the record books as one of the best ever to compete at Buffalo High School!

GIRLS BASKETBALL: Coach Scot Sorenson—(Head Coach 5 years, 10 in program)

Assistant coaches this year were Stacy Eggers, Jeff Kyllonen and Craig Geyen.

The 2008 – 2009 Bison girls basketball team started the season with several key players returning from last year. A large group of experienced seniors gave everyone great reason to be excited about the year to come. The season started with the Bison traveling to Champlin Park for a tough first round match-up. Late in the game the ball bounced in CP’s favor and we found ourselves down four when the buzzer sounded. Two home games awaited the Bison and they won both handily to get things rolling. Moving toward midseason, Buffalo had its ups and downs. A poor showing in the St. Cloud holiday tournament led to some tough losses in January. We took a chance and mixed up the starting line-up which lead to improved play through February. The Bison fought back to finish the year with a .500 record at 13-13 and 10-6 in the tough M-8 conference. The first place teams (Princeton & STMA) ended 12-4 in the M-8.

In a tight section race the Bison found themselves as a 7 seed and traveling to 2nd seeded Alexandria. Buffalo came out swinging and found themselves up 14-2 early in the game. Alex made a strong 2nd half run to take the lead with 1:30 on the clock, but Buffalo rallied and stole the opening round win from the home team. Next came a section match-up with Brainerd for the 3rd year in a row @ Wadena. Good play continued and Buffalo took home a win and a chance in the section final. That would be vs. Elk River @ SJU. Again solid play and some great free throw shooting (13 in a row the final five minutes 7 from Taylor Johnson) gave the Bison a victory and their first girls basketball state tournament birth ever! The season ended after an epic battle with Centennial and a 62-58 loss. Captains in 08-09 were DeAnne Bechtold, Hanna Rohl, and Miranda Speckel. M-8 all conference team included Speckel and Jr. Kristin Jeske. On the Honorable mention list came Sr's. Rohl, Johnson, Bechtold, and Michelle Besemann. Many season and career records were shattered by this senior group, some include: TEAM: Points in a season 1698, Rebounds in a season 937, assists in a season 622, and FG % for a season 41% INDIVIDUAL: Miranda Speckel knocked off 1989 Ms. Basketball MN in several career individual categories free throw %, 3 point attempts, makes, and % along with career/consecutive games played as she did not miss a game starting with her freshman year and competed in 109 varsity basketball games. DeAnne Bechtold set a new mark for season and career FG %. The JV made up of all sophomore finished 22-4 so as we lose one strong group, we welcome another.

WRESTLING: Coach Paul Arens—(4 years)

The Buffalo wrestling team finished the 2008-2009 season with a record of 23 wins and 8 losses. This is one of the best team records the wrestling team has had in the last 10 years. This year's team also won two individual tournaments and placed in the top three in three others. A disappointing loss in the section semi-finals ended the 2009 season. Individually the team qualified 4 individuals to the state section meet, which is the most individual qualifiers in the last four years. This year's team was lead by eight seniors. Senior David Baker broke the school record for individual wins with 123 and tied the career fall mark with 53. Junior Timmy Ruter also broke the 100 career mark making him the first junior in Buffalo history to break 100 wins. Mike Simeon also found himself in the Buffalo wrestling record book becoming the first 8th grader to qualify for the state meet. Overall the 2008-2009 season was a great success. The team competed at a high level and many career mile stones were overcome.

GIRLS GYMNASTICS: Coaches Martha Driscoll-Nelson (25 years), Jon Holtz (14)

The Bison Gymnasts had a respectable season in 2008-2009. The Varsity season record matched that of last season 4/5, with the JV gymnasts at 7/2 in regular season meets. In 3 major tournaments of 8 or more teams the BHS squad consistently finished in the middle of the pack, with the team peaking, hitting their season high score at the end, the Section 2AA Tournament. Another highlight was beating Monticello in their gym for the first time in 6 years. This put the Bison exactly in the middle of the M8 conference, behind Cambridge-Isanti, Becker, and Big Lake (perennial state leaders in the sport ranked in the top 10).

Coaches Holtz, Driscoll-Nelson, and Laumann were amazed by the teams ability to respond in a positive way to adversity, which this season came in the form of unusual injuries. No matter who was out temporarily, someone else stepped up and performed without missing a beat (flip, swing, or turn) and the team scored consistently the whole 2nd ½ of the season. Scoring leaders of the team were 3 Seniors: Briana Smith, Brooke Habisch, and Christina Bond, and 3 Sophomores, Alicia Malewicki, Dani Nordin, and Megan Durst. Bond remained a team leader even while fighting back from injuries. Smith qualified for Honorable Mention All State on uneven bars, balance beam, floor exercise, and in the All Around. Another highlight for the team was to have assistant coach Tracy Laumann named Section 2AA Assistant Coach of the year. Although the team loses 4 seniors (the above mentioned and Meghan Novak). The coaches see lots of promise in the current JV and 7/8/9 group. Next season should be a good one.

BOYS AND GIRLS ALPINE SKI: Coach Mary Bremmer--(1st year)

First day of practice was November 10, 2008. Assistant Coach Mary Bremmer was in charge for "dryland" practice which included running, weight room lifting and specific exercises to develop fit bodies for skiers. Outdoor practice was held at Powder Ridge in Kimball and began the Monday after Thanksgiving, December 1. Coach Craig Nordby was in charge for these. Practices were held on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday. Wednesdays were reserved for "tuning" and waxing skis. Team pictures were taken on Wednesday, Dec. 17th. Beginning on Thursday, Dec. 18th, the team competed in the Classic Lake Ski Conference at Buck Hill. An unusually cold winter forced the team to take days off - temperature combined with wind-chill met the guideline established by the MSHSL where practice and competition were canceled. The team participated in the Welch Invite on January 30, 2009. The Section Tournament was held at Afton Alps. Tony Aurentz and Dani Vetrano were close, but BHS failed to advance any skiers to the State Tourney. The team banquet was held in the Staff Room and the following skiers won awards. Letterwinners were: Kelly Zelko, Trenten Knese, Zach Pitcock, Clint Dille, Paul McAlpine, Tony Aurentz, Aaron Anderson, William McMillan, Paul Weinreis, Nick Olson, and Dani Vetrano. Award winners were the following: Rookie of the year - Kelly Zelko; Most improved - William McMillan and Zach Pitcock; Most Dedicated - Dani Vetrano; and Most Valuable - Tony Aurentz and Dani Vetrano.

ONE-ACT PLAY: Director Tracy Hagstrom—(17 years)

Bury the Dead:

20 students participated in the One-Act Play program during the 2008-2009 season. This year director, Tracy Hagstrom Durant, selected another interesting, educational, somewhat edgy production. Although written in 1936, Bury the Dead is a very timely play that examines the effects of war on individuals, families and our country. It seemed to fit quite well into what we are currently experiencing in the US and also hit home for local Buffalo, Hanover and Montrose residents. It was a life altering experience for our students. Once again our theatre students worked diligently and produced another winning show.

Synopsis: Written in 1936, Bury the Dead is set in war time and a military burial detail goes about its sad duties. The chaplains arrive to say prayers for the dead – but then a groan is heard from the newly dug graves, and then another. Slowly the dead soldiers rise up, pleading not to be buried, asking to be allowed to rejoin the living. Word of their insurrection spreads rapidly – to the soldiers in the field, the generals, the news media, with alarming effect. In a series of touching scenes, the dead men talk with their loved ones of the days of living, now lost forever. But must the dead yield so easily? As the play ends, the corpses rise and move away, while a shaken general stand by helpless to stop them.

BOYS SWIMMING: Coach Ryan Rehnstrand—(5 years)

The Buffalo Boy's Swimming and Diving Team had its best season in it's 5 year existences. Our dual meet record was 9-5 but would have been 11-3 if we did not intentionally hide our line-up for preparation for sections. We broke 9 school records and sent our first two state participants in team history. JD O'Donnell (9th) qualified in the 500 freestyle and Nathan Engfer (12th) qualified in the 100 butterfly. JD ended up 24th at state and Nathan was 12th and qualified for finals. The Bison Swimming and Diving team was Academic State Runner-up for both single A and Double A.

At sections we had 90% of the section team qualify for the second day of competition. And we placed 5th overall (Best Section Finish) with 10 swimmers and divers placing in the top 8 in at least one event. The Buffalo Swimming and Diving team was Section 8 AA Academic Champions.

The boy's team placed 3rd in the conference (Best Conference Finish). We had four All-Academic award winners, three All-Conference Honorable Mention, and 6 All-Conference winners (Most ever in team history).

I am very pleased how well the team hung in there even after being told about possibly being cut. On every overnight trip and away meet, I was constantly being told how nice, mature, and well behaved my team was at every outing.

As a team we only are losing two seniors and looking forward to next season. We are planning on taking a run at conference championship and place in the top two at sections. I am also hoping to have someone place in the top 8 at state.

DRUM LINE: Advisor David Harri—(2 years)

The winter drumline had a great season this year. Though this year's show was challenging the students stepped up and handled it very well. With a record number of 36 members the group was again one of the largest in the state. Every time we met we achieved at a higher and higher levels up until our final performance.

KNOWLEDGE BOWL: Coach Peggy Pasche-- (19th year)

The Knowledge Bowl team consisted of 27 students in grades 9-12. These students were divided up into 5 teams in practice and competition. This year, the majority of our students were 10th and 11th graders. The 3 varsity teams competed in 9 invitational meets this season. These competitions were against anywhere from 35-60 teams. The top Buffalo team placed **first** in every single meet except two of them - where they were 2nd in both of those. That top team also won the Mississippi 8 Knowledge Bowl tournament (for the 4th year in a row). Because of their first place finish, 5 students from Buffalo were named as All-Conference members: Senior Elizabeth Logas and Juniors Gina Filo, Neil Gleason and Jensen Maiden and Sophomore Jonathon Hank. The team placed 1st at sub-regions, competed at Regions on April 1st, and advanced to State for the seventh time in the last nine years. They will be competing mid April at Craguns.

SPEECH: Coach Mike Worcester—(5th Year)

The BHS speech team had first year assistant coach Will Florsheim and twenty kids participate this year. Practices began in early December. Regular season tournaments began January 29, running through March 20. The team competed in ten invitationals, capturing team trophies at three of those—Becker, Centennial, and Milaca. We had no conference champions this year, but did have six all-conference runners up.

Our home tournament was held Saturday, March 7th. We had almost 500 students from nineteen schools competing. Add to that the coaches, judges, and other adults, and there were almost 600 people in the school that day. Seventy individual classrooms were used to accommodate tournament participants, along with the Media Center, commons, and PAC. A tournament of that size simply cannot run without the assistance of coaches from other schools, parents to help staff the concession stands, and the custodians, who put in a long day themselves as the building had three other events scheduled for that day. This home meet is our one big fundraiser to the year, which helps defray the operational costs of the team.

The modern BHS speech team began in the 1972-73 school year. With the likelihood of a co-op team being formed with St. Michael-Albertville beginning next year, there will be several details to be firmed up. Our hope is to provide the maximum number of competitive opportunities for our returning team members—we lose only one senior from this year's team—and for the junior high team members who will enter the high school next season.

GIRLS AND BOYS NORDIC SKI: Coach: Jill Hanson—(9 years, 6 years head coach)

The Nordic ski team started the season with a group of new skiers and returning skiers who were also young. We only had to spend a few weeks with dry land training and then the first snow came. We were hopeful to have our own course groomed this season but the death of the snowmobile ended that dream and we were back traveling to the local golf courses and to Elm Creek. It was a season of cold but we had snow.

High lights: Girls for the 2nd year won the Wilmar Classic Invitational. Our girl's team was senior less for skiers but our manager, Kristina Borgstrom, was a very dedicated and irreplaceable senior. It was like having another coach on the team. We continue to finish most races as a better than average team but we have not beaten the "good teams". We closed the gap this year with a group of freshman and sophomores and have/had great hopes of taking that step next season. We had no one outstanding skier but a group that worked well together and liked each other. We took 6th at the section where we felt we had skied well in the morning (classic) but got tired for the PM race. Again with the younger kids we know they will only get better and stronger. It is a group of skiers who enjoy skiing and enjoy each other.

Our boy's team was the biggest ever to date where we were fielding a JV team as well as a legitimate varsity team. Kevin Hayes led the boys and did an outstanding job both as a skier and a leader. Our team was growing and we were getting competitive. We finished 7th in the section meet this season. We had people competing for positions on the varsity team. We were also looking forward to the future. Skiing is such a unique sport.

MOCK TRIAL: Coach Laurie Raymond— (15 years)

Assistant Coach was Evan Ronken and attorney coaches were Karen Wolff and Kevin Tierney. The season went from October to March.

The first competition at Lakeville South was not team awards but awards for best lawyers and witnesses. Receiving an outstanding lawyer award was Graham Wyatt and receiving an outstanding witness award was Lindy Jensen.

The first tournament was held at the University of MN tournament in January. Individual lawyer awards were given to Beth Macnab and Graham Wyatt. Receiving an individual witness's award was Lindy Jensen. The team also placed 6th overall. In other January tournaments they received 1st at the Apollo and 2nd at the Apple Valley Tournaments. AT APOLLO THEY BROKE TWO SCHOOL RECORDS ON TOTAL TENS IN A COMPETITION AND TOTAL SCORE.

1. The varsity team received a score of 137 out of a possible 140. We were awarded 11 tens and 3 nines.
2. For the two competitions the varsity received a total 26 tens from 4 judges.

BHS Mock Trial won the Mississippi 8 Conference title, 4th year in a row, beating Monticello RECEIVING ALL CONFERENCE AWARDS WERE ATTORNEY'S JACOB WESTMAN AND GRAHAM WYATT. WITNESSES RECEIVING ALL CONFERENCE WERE LINDY JENSEN AND KENZIE HAIGHT. ALL CONFERENCE HONORABLE MENTIONS AWARDS WENT TO WITNESSES MICHAEL CHENOWETH AND COLM MACNAB AND ATTORNEY MICHAEL PORTTIIN.

Both the Varsity and JV won the first three rounds of the region and that pitted the Varsity vs., the JV in round four. The varsity won and they moved onto the championship round in Region Three. The JV set a new school record for going to round four. In round five the Varsity won and became the Region 4 Champions and earned the right to participate at the State Competition that was held in Duluth on March 10th and 11th.

They lost a close match in round one, by three points that put them in the loser's bracket, then won round 2 and scored 13 plus points to put them against the number one seed, Lakeville North in round three. They lost by one point, Lakeville North advanced to the championship round and Buffalo went home. Winning individual awards at state were lawyer Graham Wyatt and witness Lindy Jensen. Our over all record was 23-2 for the season. Overall wins in State competitions has been 61-3 for the last three years. They also made it to state three out of the last four years.

WINTER CHEERLEADING: Coach Barb Christensen-- (4th year):

The season was off to an early start this year with several of the cheerleaders participating in both Fall and Winter. The squad focused on boy's basketball and community involvement along with promoting the reading program at Northwinds Elementary. The girls worked together with the Chamber of Commerce in welcoming businesses and spectators at the Community Expo in February. They also worked with the Buffalo hockey boosters to host the FSN High School Hockey night and the basketball boosters to host the Pat Sonju Memorial game. The season came to an end with the boy's basketball team loss in the section final game.

DANCE TEAM: Coach Lyssa Lovejoy— (3rd year)

Buffalo Show Stoppers finished 3rd in the conference. We had a whole new team with the exceptions of 4 team members from last year. Two of those 4 will be heading off to college this year. We were particularly proud of our Jazz routine that showcased very difficult turns and lyrical choreography. We also had a new assistant coach this year, Britta Schumacher. We did some fun activities with our girls this year, but were pressed for time as it seemed our season always seems short.. Our favorite trip was the Snow Tubing, a team building event we scheduled mid-season. I am proud of all our team members and all that they accomplished this season. We learned so much this year about individuality and creativity... Krissy Schumacher received All Conference honors along with Sadie Jepson and Kaylene Born receiving Honorable Mention.
