BACKGROUND:

The National ESEA (Elementary and Secondary Education Act) Distinguished Schools Program is a project of NAESPA that publicly recognizes qualifying federally-funded schools for positive educational advances and the outstanding academic achievement of their students. Established in 1996, the program showcases hundreds of schools identified by the State Education Agency for their success in one of three categories:

- Category 1: Schools exhibiting exceptional student performance and academic growth
- Category 2: Schools that have closed the achievement gap between student groups
- Category 3: Schools that show excellence in serving special populations of students (e.g. homeless, migrant, English learners, etc.)

Schools are named by their State Education Agency (up to two schools per state) and collectively exhibit the following common characteristics:

- A poverty rate of at least 35% for the selected year (may use the state's average poverty rate to qualify a school if below 35%)
- Demonstrated high academic achievement (which may include high academic growth)
- Met or exceeded state-determined accountability criteria
- Must be federally funded by one or more ESEA programs

The school selection process is open from October 7 – November 15, 2024.
