
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# (Carol Grant: Kindergarten Leader)

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students mastered the vocabulary and are confidently using these new words in sentences. Our Kindergarten students have been working hard and making great progress on the ASLA skills with Mrs. Vielle. During Specials the students have been learning about traditional transportation. The students learned about dog days, and how we acquired horses. How using horses and dogs made life easier to follow the buffalo herds across the prairie.

The students also reviewed shapes, color, and animals. Our Blackfeet words for the month were the colors pink and purple, along with winter, cloudy, eagle, mouse and how to say the month of February.

Through the cold winds of winter to the warm winds of spring, we are barreling through the school year. As always, Specialists are creating memories for students.

In PE, the Little Learners are learning their colors and shapes in both English and Blackfeet. They then have to find their match using techniques such as crawling like a turtle or gallop like an elk. First graders and Kindergarteners are playing shark attack with the parachute incorporating low, medium, and high spaces into the exercise. Meanwhile in music the students are performing the Three Little Pigs using bells, rattles, singing and using xylophones. In the meantime, the library is finishing up "I Love To Read" month. Our students turned in 5,432 Reading responses; an increase of 156.19 percent over last year. Mrs. Bird Rattler's class had the honor of throwing the pies this year. Mrs. Shooter's class with 302 Reading responses earned cupcakes and a dedicated book.
