FPC Rahll Campus Board Report November 2024

- Dalhart EDC presented the check for the HDJT Grant. PRPC/TWC will match the funds for a total of \$300,000. These funds will purchase diesel mechanics equipment.
- The Rahll Campus hosted a Welding Advisory Meeting on campus. We had numerous local industry partners provide valuable feedback.
- Attended CDL Department meeting regarding the CDL program moving forward.
