RE: Community Council for the Arts Scholarship Opportunity

The attached document is a Scholarship Application for a new scholarship opportunity for students in our district. The Community Council for the Arts was a not-for-profit organization that disbanded recently. As such, they must disburse their funds to another not-for-profit organization, for which they chose to donate a significant sum (about \$7,000) to our Foundation. Since they now lack any organizational structure, they asked if they can donate the money to the Foundation to establish and manage a scholarship in their name.

The attached document is in the same format, with the Council's input, as our two Foundation scholarships. Please review. The proposal will be submitted at our April monthly board meeting for approval with the hope to distribute the application timely with the 2021-2022 scholarship award season. Should you have any questions, please feel free to ask anytime. ■

Community Council for the Arts Scholarship

The Community Council of the Arts was a not-for-profit organization formed in Pana, Illinois to support local artists. The Council dissolved and donated its remaining funds, by law and consistent with the Council's constitution, to the Pana Education Foundation. The Foundation is another local not-for-profit organization created to support educational initiatives in and around the Pana Community Unit School District.

The Community Council for the Arts Scholarship (the "Scholarship") was created to honor the Council's history by providing financial assistance to qualified students seeking further education with accredited institutions of higher learning. Each year a scholarship will be awarded by the Foundation to a qualified applicant pursuing a degree in the creative arts, including painting, visuals, graphics, photography and sculpturing.

The Foundation will award 1 scholarship each year to graduating seniors of Pana High School (PHS), from which the funds may be used for tuition, fees, books, supplies and other associated costs at post-secondary educational institutions. Scholarship recipients are eligible for an initial grant in the amount of \$500 each semester for an annual award of \$1,000. The recipients will be announced at the Pana High School annual awards ceremony.

Application.

Each applicant must submit the attached Application by the declared deadline. Each applicant must be in the top half of their graduating class with a grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 (out of 4.0 scale). The application must include a copy of the applicant's PHS transcript and a letter of recommendation from a current Pana High School Arts educator. Applicants seeking a degree in higher education in the creative arts, as described above, will only be given consideration.

Continued Eligibility.

Each recipient is expected to maintain a B average or greater each semester (3.0 or greater on a 4.0 scale), enroll in at least twelve (12) hours of post-secondary educational instruction at an approved institution, and remain in good standing under the institution's governing standards. If a recipient's grade point average falls below the required B average in any semester, the recipient will be placed on probationary status and will not receive their award unless the student achieves the required B average on a cumulative basis in the subsequent semester.

Payment.

The Foundation will issue a check in the amount of \$500 to each recipient following the conclusion of each semester upon the receipt of an official transcript from the recipients' institution of higher learning.

Disclaimer. The Foundation will appoint a committee to independently review scholarship applications to ensure each is submitted and completed according the scholarship's program policies and rules. All decisions must be approved by the Foundation's Board of Directors, and all decisions by the Board are final. Additional rules and guidelines adopted by the Foundation may apply to recipients upon successful award. All questions may be directed to the Foundation President, Rebecca Beeson at (217) 273-1564.
