GREAT HISTORY CHALLENGE

On February 24th, 4 students from Clute Intermediate joined students from all over the state of Texas at the Regional Great History Challenge competition at Angleton Junior High. All 4 students from CIS qualified for the National competition that will be held on May 23-25, 2025, at the Hilton Orlando in Orlando, Florida. Students had to compete in three rounds (and one bi-round) of history questions ranging from Ancient Myths to Modern History. The first to buzz in and answer correctly received a point for a max of 10 per round. The students with the highest number of points after all four rounds were invited to Nationals. TEXAS HISTORY DAY

Students in honors history classes participated in the Texas History Day competition for the first time this year. The theme for 2025 was "Rights and Responsibilities". Thirty-six students qualified for the regional meet held in Sugar Land on February 22nd. Three of our students placed first or second in that competition, making them eligible to compete at the state level. On Saturday, April 5th, students from around the state met at the Bullock Texas State History Museum in Austin to showcase their knowledge and talent. Educational Results Partnership's 2024 Honor Roll Recipients

We are pleased to announce OM Roberts, Brannen, and Polk Elementary as earning the recognition on the ERP (Educational Results Partnership) Honor Roll list. This list recognizes top public schools, school districts, and charter schools in Texas that have outperformed their peers in closing achievement gaps, particularly among higher-poverty and historically disadvantaged student populations.

This year, 63 school districts in Texas made the Honor Roll. This is approximately 9 percent of all eligible districts in the state. Results are based on data of student outcomes on the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR) for the 2022 through 2024 academic years.

This effort is part of a national campaign to engage business leaders in recognizing successful schools and educational systems that are preparing students with the fundamental skills needed to be successful in the workforce and in life. The Honor Roll is the only school recognition program based solely on objective student achievement data, with the goal of finding and highlighting successful districts and encouraging collaboration among educators on best practices for raising student achievement.

The Texas Honor Roll is presented by the <u>Campaign for Business and Education Excellence</u> in collaboration with the <u>Texas Business Leadership Council</u> and other business leaders across the state.

The flag football league had games for six weeks on Saturday mornings at Slade Field and had 56 players participating last fall and 56 players participating this spring. 31 current Brazoswood football players serve as coaches and referees, and student trainers volunteer their time to be available. Last fall, our student logged over 490 volunteer service hours supporting this opportunity for our 5th & 6th-grade students to participate in a flag football League.
