## LOOKING

- 1 Growing requests for care from 6 weeks to 30 months
- 1:4 infant-to-adult licensing ratio
- 5 Doubling in staffing, space, and regulatory requirements
- Need for qualified ECE professionals, not just caregivers
- **Exploring a 5-year goal:** 
  - → A dedicated NBAS Early Childhood Education Center
    - → Serving children ages 6 weeks 4 years
