Presentations & Recognitions W.S. Ryan Elementary has been named a 2022-2024 National PTA School of Excellence, an honor which aims to provide a framework for PTAs to identify and implement best practices in family engagement to strengthen family-school partnerships. W.S. Ryan Elementary was one of only 72 schools in Texas to earn the distinction for 2022-2024. Less than 400 schools nationwide received the honor.

Each year, the Texas Association of School Boards (TASB) honors businesses and organizations for their support and exceptional advocacy of public schools. This statewide honor, as part of “Stand Up for Texas Public Schools,” recognizes local businesses and community organizations that partner with school districts, making a difference in the lives of public-school students.

Interfaith Ministries, formerly known as the Apple Tree Project, is a coalition of local Denton churches which, through various faith-based organizations, donors and grants, help serve over 3,000 people annually in northern Denton County. This year, Interfaith Ministries was instrumental in helping Denton ISD provide free backpacks to students during both of the district’s annual Back-to-School Fairs.
