# Student/Teacher Ratios Class Size Statutes

- Mandatory ratios per Texas Education Code §25.111
  - The district must employ "sufficient" number of certified teachers
  - The district must maintain not less than one teacher per 20 students in ADA
- Texas Education Code §25.112
  - School district may not enroll more than 22 students in PK – 4<sup>th</sup> Grade unless a waiver is requested from the commissioner

### Student Enrollment Projections



- Collaborative Process:
  - Academic Programs
    - Special Education
  - Curriculum & Instruction
    - Bilingual/ESL
  - Business Operations
  - Human Resources
- Data Points:
  - Demographer 3Q/4Q Growth Reports
  - Current Student Enrollment
  - Early Enrollment





- Projected class sizes for regular education classes utilize predictions based on data provided from current enrollment, early enrollment, and the demographer projections based on growth and new home builds
- Student-Teacher ratios are applied to enrollment levels

Student:Teacher Staffing Ratios

**Grades PK-2 = 22:1** 

**Grades 3-4 = 24:1** 

**Grades 5 = 25:1** 

# Secondary General Staffing



**Factor (1.33) x Projected Student Enrollment** 

**Ratio (25)** 

**Factor:** 8-period day schedule / six sections taught by each teach

Ratio: 25 students per section

- 1. Campus FTE allocations based on student course
- 2. Year to year adjustments made for program participation (growth or decline)

## Differentiated Staffing by Program



#### Emergent Bilingual

- Elementary: ESL (.5) increases to 1.0 when bilingual emergent students ≥ 50
- Middle School: 35:1
- High School: 40:1

#### Special Education

- Teachers & Aides based on program and campus level
  - Case workload of Special Education population
- The number of staffing units per program is adjusted based on individual student needs
  - Self-contained classrooms 1 teacher and 2 teacher aides
- Diagnosticians, LSSPs and Speech Pathologists staffed based on caseloads due to additional services required and additional ARD meetings

#### Gifted Education

One EXPO teacher with additional support as student numbers increase

#### **State Comp Ed Funded**

- Elementary
  - Math Interventionist (.5) / (1.0 at priority campuses)
  - Reading Interventionist (.5) / (1.0 at priority campuses)
  - Literacy Support K-2 /Reading Recovery
  - Literacy Support K-2/DLL Bilingual Campuses
- Middle School
  - Reading Interventionist (1)
- High School
  - At-Risk Liaison (DHS/RHS)

#### **Title Campuses (>40% Economically Disadvantaged)**

- Supplemental support for intervention, CIS, Instructional Coaching, or Student Assistance Counseling utilizing campus Title I funds.
- District Instructional Coaches (.5) assigned by the District

#### **Extra State Comp Ed Funded (>70% Economically Disadvantaged)**

• Additional supplemental support for intervention, Instructional Coaching, or Student Assistance Counseling utilizing campus Title I funds Campus Intervention Specialists
