












Q.2: How confident do you feel supporting your child's academic learning at home/ outside of school?








Q.3: How confident do you feel supporting your child's social and emotional learning at home/ outside of school?


















Q.7: The school regularly shares ideas with me on what I can do at home to support my child's learning.
















Q.1: How often do you have conversations with your child about what they are learning at school?




Q.2: How often do you have conversations with your child about career or college preparation?



Q.3: How often do you connect activities that you do at home to what your child is learning in school?













Q.5: How many children in your household are currently attending this school?






