EXECUTIVE SUMMARY/BACKGROUND: MyAccess/WriteVue Data & Analytics will assist the school district in providing state-of-the-art solutions for writing assessments. My Access is a data-based online platform that is utilized for writing instruction and an assessment platform which improves student writing proficiency and motivates students to write more frequently by providing immediate scores and continual, adaptive feedback and edit suggestions. MyAccess licensing provides for the creation of systematic formative and summative assessments throughout all Southfield Public School buildings for the 2024-2025 school year.

COST BENEFIT ANALYSIS: My Access writing program reveals that its implementation in the school district would provide substantial educational benefits, such as improved student writing skills and streamlined assessment processes.

RECOMMENDATION: The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education approve the purchase of MyAccess in an amount not to exceed \$78,000.00.

IMPACT IF NOT APPROVED: If not approved, the school district may miss out on significant opportunities to enhance student writing proficiency and streamline grading processes, potentially impacting overall academic performance and resource efficiency.

NEXT STEPS IF APPROVED: If approved, the next steps will involve finalizing the implementation plan, providing training for educators, and integrating the My Access writing program into the curriculum for the upcoming school year.
