Staff were learning the programs and while plans were made, they were not fully implemented. In 2020, in spite of the pandemic, plans were developed for all students and progress toward goals was made. In 2021 and 2022, SSP's were established, followed with fidelity, and student goals were adjusted to meet student needs.

PCVA students are able to work at the pace needed to complete the		

PCVA students are able to work at the pace needed to complete the courses. Individual needs are met by pacing learning as needed. Students have the ability to work outside the normal Monday-Friday school week. Credit is awarded based on subject matter competency. Staff monitor students' progress on a weekly basis to make sure they are meeting goals. Teachers work with parents and students to help ensure success in the program. This waiver supports the goal of flexibility. Since Driven Virtual Academy is virtual, a recess waiver is also requested. Recess time is in the suggested schedule for students, but flexibility can be at the parent's discretion as well as what activities constitute "recess time".

If the waiver is continued, will the service be provided in an alternate way?

Yes. Student progress is monitored by percentage of course completed based on estimated amount of time for the course which adheres to state standards. Completion of the course qualifies for the suggested amount of time for a semester.

Students in PCVA self pace and work at any time. Course completion will validate students' effort and will be monitored by staff. The waiver for attendance has allowed students to complete courses at a faster pace but also in a time that works with their needs such as work schedules, health needs, etc. Staff maintain student progress communicating quickly if students fall behind. This waiver supports the goal of flexibility for both students who accelerate and those who struggle.
