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Public Health Considerations

While it is not possible to eliminate all risk of furthering the spread of COVID-19, the current science suggests there are many steps schools can take to reduce the risks to students, teachers, staff, and their families significantly.

- PROVIDE NOTICE: Requirements for parental and public notices
- PREVENT: Required practices to prevent the virus from entering the school
- RESPOND: Required practices to respond to a lab-confirmed case in the school
- MITIGATE: Recommended and required practices to reduce likely spread inside the school

Public Health Considerations

Will a classroom, campus or district have to close if a member of the school community tests positive for COVID?

Denton ISD COVID team will work in collaboration with Denton County Public Health Department to monitor each situation. In situations where members of the school community maintained physical distance and wore face coverings, a positive case will not result in a class or school closure. In situations where two or more linked cases are within the same classroom space, consideration will be given to closure of the classroom.


Definition of "Close Contact"


Being directly exposed to infectious secretions (e.g., being coughed on)

Being within 6 feet for a cumulative duration of 15 minutes; however factors like case/contact masking (i.e., both the infectious individual and potential close contact have been consistently and properly masked), ventilation, presence of dividers, and case symptomatology may affect this determination.
