INFORMATIONAL REPORT:

House Bill (HB) 5 replaces the Minimum High School Program (MHSP), Recommended High School Program (RHSP), and Distinguished Achievement Program (DAP) with the foundation program starting with the 2014-2015 school year. All other students currently in high school will remain on the Distinguished, Recommended or Minimum Plans. Districts must offer the courses required for the current minimum, recommended, and distinguished graduation plans for at least three years until the 2013-2014 freshman class graduates.

Presentation outlines the recommendations for the implementation of the Foundation High School Program. Students currently in the 8th grade—the class of 2018—will be the first group required to graduate under this new plan. Beginning with the freshman class of the 2014-2015 school year, every student will have to select a foundation plan as well as one of five endorsements, depending on their interests. The five endorsements include STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics), Business/Industry, Humanities/Art, Public Service and Multidisciplinary. A student can change their endorsement at any time prior to graduation. The minimum graduation requirement is the foundation plan, and students can choose to graduate with the upper-level endorsement plan or distinguished plan.

HB Plan Graduation Plan

- During the 83rd Texas Legislature, House Bill 5
 was signed into law, which changes high school
 graduation requirements for students who will be
 freshmen during the 2014–2015 school year.
- The SBOE (State Board of Education) adopted new rules for the Foundation High School Program on January 31, 2014.
- The SBOE is expected to adopt new rules regarding which courses school districts will be required to offer in April 2014.



Foundation: Statutory Requirements

- Beginning in the 2014–2015 school year, a school district must ensure that each student, on entering ninth grade, indicates in writing an endorsement that the student intends to earn.
- A district must permit a student to choose, at any time, to earn an endorsement other than the endorsement the student previously indicated



Foundation: Statutory Requirements

A student may graduate under the Foundation High School Program without earning an endorsement if, after the student's sophomore year:

- 1. The student and the student's parent or person standing in parental relation are advised by a school counselor of the specific benefits of graduating from high school with one or more endorsements; and
- 2. the student's parent or person standing in parental relation files with a school counselor written permission, on a form adopted by the agency, allowing the student to graduate under the foundation high school program without earning an endorsement


A student may earn an endorsement by successfully completing:

- Curriculum requirements for the endorsement
- Four credits in mathematics
- Four credits in science
- Two additional elective credits



Texas High School Diploma

DISTINGUISHED ACHIEVEMENT = Eligible for Top 10% Automatic Admission



FOUNDATION = 22 CREDITS

Eligible for General Admission

- 4 English Language Arts (ELA I, II, III & advanced English) --> Required EOCs: English I and English II R/W combined
- 3 Mathematics (Algebra I, Geometry, & 1 advanced math) --> Required EOC: Algebra I
- 3 Soc. Studies (W. Geography or W. History or combined, US History, & government/economics)--> Required EOC: US History
- 3 Science (Biology, IPC or advanced science, and additional advanced science) --> Required EOC: Biology
- 2 Foreign Languages/programming*

How will Colleges Recognize the FHSP/Endorsements/DLA?

- Current data is not available on how colleges will recognize Endorsements in the future or if students will be admitted to certain majors beyond college admissions criteria
- Colleges will continue to evaluate transcripts for the types of courses taken and grades earned, along with test scores and the academic résumé.



Additional Graduation Requirements — Assessments

Students must meet State Standards on the following EOC Assessments:

- 1. English I
- 2. Algebra I
- 3. Biology
- 4. English II
- 5. U.S. History





Magnet Program

- Students chosen to a magnet program will be assigned to the endorsement corresponding to their specialty
- A student may change the endorsement upon consultation with the magnet dean and counselor
- To graduate under the magnet seal, students must complete all magnet requirements if endorsement is changed from specialty endorsement
