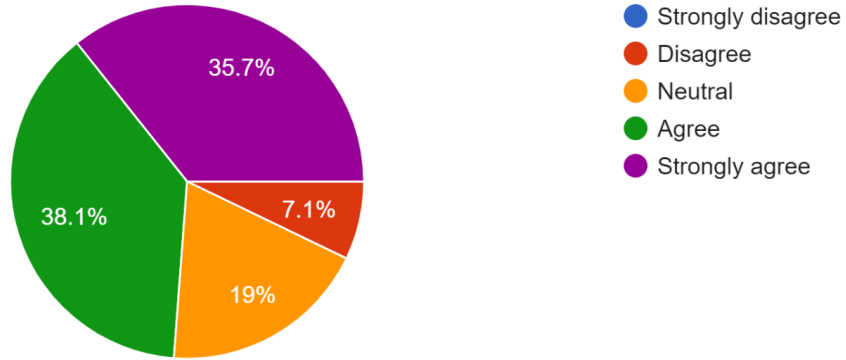


Results 2023-2024 CCS Seat-Based Parent/Guardian Survey

The school board and committees are working in the best interest of the students and CCS.

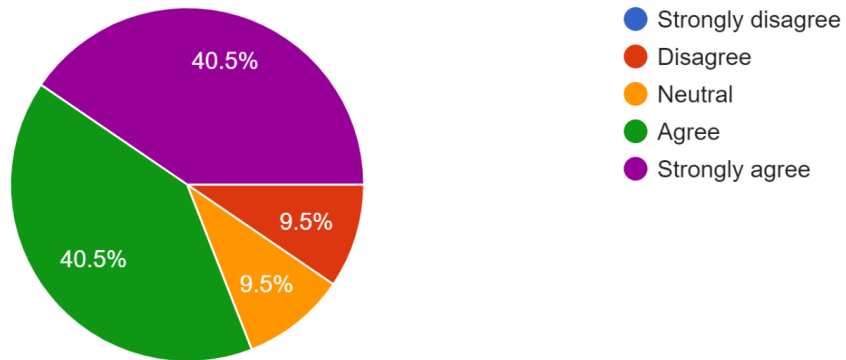

I would describe CCS as a safe and orderly place.

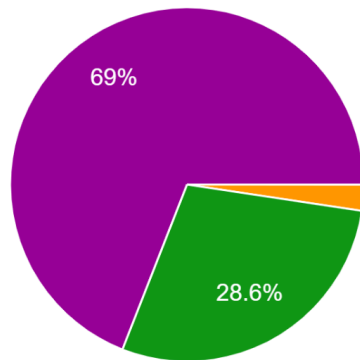

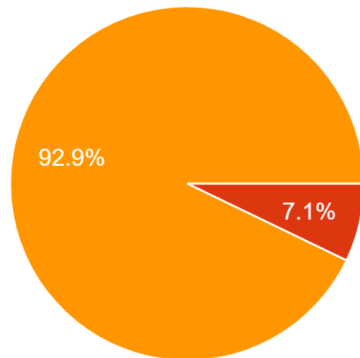

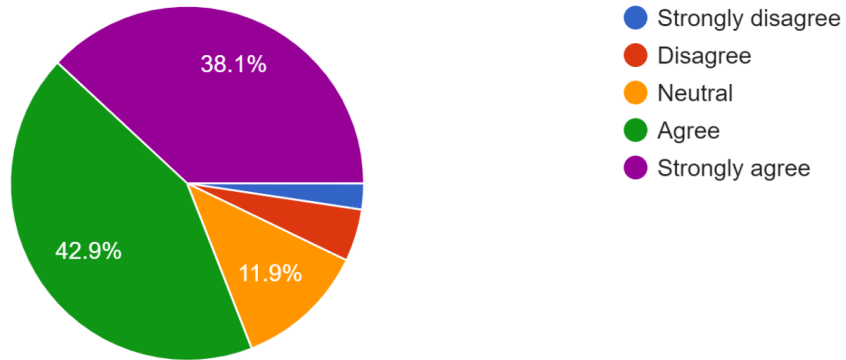

My student is well prepared for their next level of schooling through the curriculum, testing, and supplemental resources offered at CCS.

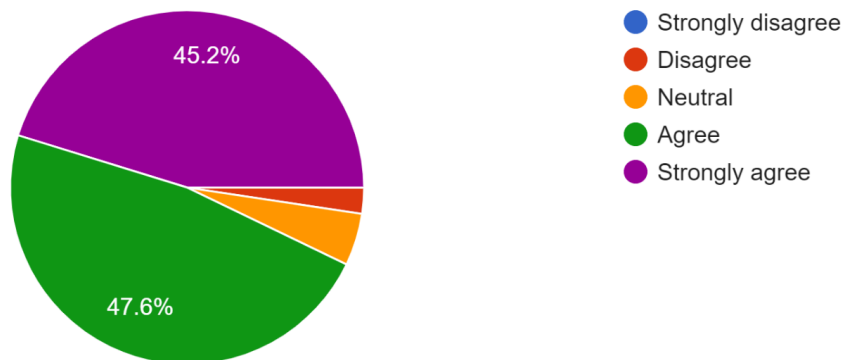

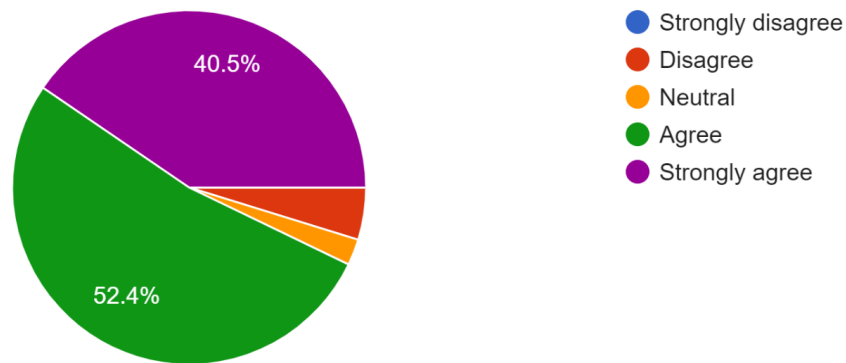
My student sometimes struggles with noise and the classroom being chaotic. Especially during art class

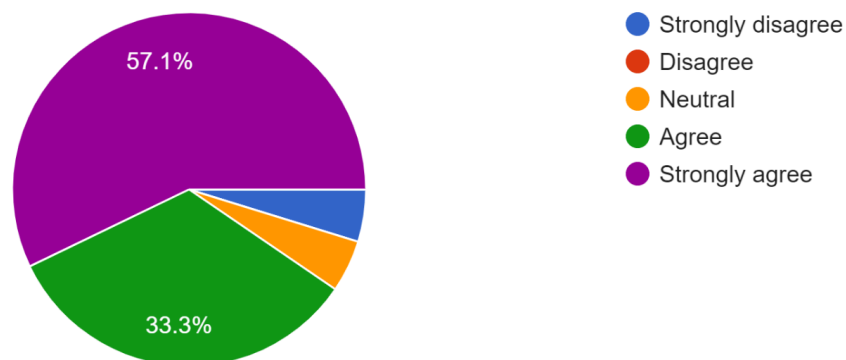
