April was another busy and exciting month. Kindergarteners worked on their alphabet and learned how books are shelved in the library. First graders focused on Fairy Tales. First they created code story maps for the Ozobots to Goldilocks and the 3 Bears. They also built structures to hold their characters or keep them safe for The 3 Little Pigs, The 3 Billy Goats Gruff, or The 3 Bears. 2nd, 3rd and 5th graders learned more about how the library works and being respectful, responsible, and safe users of technology. The fourth graders kicked off their study of National Parks with a virtual online visit with a park ranger visit of Timucuan ecological preserve in Jacksonville, Florida. They will be researching a National Park of their choice and then creating a promotional video for it. You should have seen a reusable free pass to National Parks come home.
