

# Annual Report on Programs Financed by 10% Maintenance and Operations Override

# General Information about a Budget Override

- Arizona law permits school districts to obtain local voter approval to *override* the state budget formulas for a school district's Capital and/or Maintenance and Operations (M&O) budgets.
- Funds received through the override can only be used for the specific purposes approved by the voters.
- The amount of budget increase is limited to the percentage amount approved by the voters and for the length of time authorized by the voters.
- M&O overrides, for example, cannot increase an M&O budget by more than 15%.





# State Limitations on School District Spending

- Regardless of a school district's tax base or its level of need, each school district is limited by state formulas to the amount it can spend M&O and Capital funds.
- Except for bonds, state formulas generally tie spending to the number of enrolled students.
- Arizona school districts do not have authority to increase their budget without voter-approval to *override* the budget set through state formula.





### Amphitheater's Override

- Amphitheater currently has a 10% general M&O budget override in place.
- This update focuses only on the <u>current</u> 10% M&O override as required by A.R.S. 15-481(Y).
- It does not address Prop 476 (election proposition to be decided November 5, 2019) which seeks an additional 3.5% override of the Kindergarten through Third Grade budget to:
  - Pay for free all-day kindergarten throughout the District (thereby freeing up Title 1 funds for other student interventions for all elementary grades), and
  - Reduce kindergarten through third grade class sizes to maximum student numbers of:
    - Kindergarten 25 students
    - First Grade 25 students
    - Second Grade 26 students
    - Third Grade 27 students.
- There is an FAQ about Prop 475 (election proposition to renew the 10% M&O override also to be decided on November 5, 2019) and Prop 476 (see above) available for review on the District website.







# History of Amphitheater's 10% M&O Override

#### November 2004

Blue Ribbon Budget Analysis Committee of community members recommended that the Amphitheater Governing Board seek voter approval of a 10% M&O override to be used for:

- Class size reduction,
- Enhanced Art, Music, & PE classes at Elementary schools,
- Increased middle & high school electives,
- Academic Intervention Programs,
- Enhancements to staff compensation to help maintain competition, and
- Addition of 3 to 4 support staff members to meet growing facilities needs.







### **Amphitheater Voters Have Approved the Existing Override Three Times**

•First Approved in May 2005

•Renewed in November 2009

•Renewed again in November 2014





### Current Status of 10% M&O Override

- 10% M&O override is a seven-year override
  - Provides budget override increase of 10% of M&O budget for first 5 years,
  - Phases down by 1/3 in year 6 and by another 1/3 in year 7, and
  - Ceases in year 8 and budget returns to regular state budget.
- This is the *final* year of the full 10% M&O budget override unless Amphitheater's electors vote to renew it by approving Prop 475 on November 5, 2019.
- If not renewed, the phase down will begin next school year:
  - Amphitheater's M&O budget will phase down by 1/3 in SY 2020-2021,
  - Then, it will phase down by another 1/3 in SY 2021-2022, and
  - Override will cease, and Amphitheater goes back to regular state budget, in SY 2022-2023.





### 10% M&O Override Amount

- The 10% budget override amount is 10% of the amount of funding the state provides Amphitheater each year.
- When the state education funding is higher, then the 10% budget increase is higher.
- In 2005, override amount was approximately \$8.1 million because state education funding and student enrollment were higher then.
- Override currently provides \$7,854,501 in additional funding to Amphitheater Public Schools.

### Class Sizes Before the Override

• Elementary Schools: Regularly above 30 students

#### Middle School:

- English and Writing classes up to 35 students
- Math and Science classes were as high as 38 students

### • High School:

• English, Math, and Science classes exceeded 35 students





# Class Size Reduction Provided by the 10% M&O Override

- This year, the 10% M&O override added the following additional teachers:
  - 8.8 FTE Elementary Teachers
  - 2.4 FTE Middle School Teachers
  - 3.2 FTE High School Teachers
- For some of these teachers, the M&O budget only afforded a partial contract, but class size reduction funds provided through the override enabled the teacher's position to become a full-time position and increase the number of classes offered by that teacher.
- This has enabled the District to hire better qualified teachers since it is easier to hire a full-time teacher than a part-time one.







### **Dedicated Certificated Teachers to Teach Art in Elementary Schools**

- The M&O override permits the District to provide a certificated art teacher at every one of its elementary schools.
- The funding provides for a <u>full-time</u> art teacher at each of the District's twelve (12) elementary schools and two (2) K-8 schools.
- This year, the 10% M&O override adds 3.9 FTE Art Teachers in elementary schools.
- Like with class size reduction, the M&O budget only affords a partial contract for art at the elementary schools, but funding from the 10% M&O override enables the art teachers to be full-time and expand the amount of time students have in art class each week.
- This has enabled the District to hire better qualified teachers since it is easier to hire a full-time teacher than a part-time one.







# Dedicated Certificated Teachers to Teach Music in Elementary Schools

- The M&O override permits the District to provide a certificated music teacher at every one of its elementary schools.
- The funding provides for a full-time music teacher at each of the District's twelve (12) elementary schools and two (2) K-8 schools.
- This adds **4.0 FTE Music Teachers** in elementary schools.
- Like art, the M&O budget only affords a partial teacher contract for music at elementary schools, but funding through the override enabled the music teacher to be full-time and expand the amount of time students have in music class each week.
- This has enabled the District to hire better qualified teachers since it is easier to hire a full-time teacher than a part-time one.







## Dedicated Certificated Teachers to Teach Physical Education in Elementary Schools

- The M&O override permits the District to provide a certificated physical education teacher at every one of its elementary schools.
- The funding provides for a full-time physical education teacher at each of the District's twelve (12) elementary schools and two (2) K-8 schools.
- This adds *3.4 FTE Physical Education Teachers* in elementary schools.
- Like music, the M&O budget only affords a partial contract for physical education teachers at elementary schools, but funding through the override enabled the elementary PE teacher to be full-time and expand the amount of time students have in PE class each week.
- This has enabled the District to hire better qualified teachers since it is easier to hire a full-time teacher than a part-time one.



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## **Advanced Learning Programs and Elective Courses at Middle School**

- Through the 10% M&O override this year, advanced learning and elective courses are being funded at each middle school and K-8 school.
- Course offerings include:
  - Career Exploration,
  - Fine Arts,
  - Science,
  - Programming, and
  - Technology.

# **Advanced Learning Programs and Elective Courses at High Schools**

This year, the 10% M&O override also funds additional courses for high school students.

The courses provided this year through the M&O override include:

- Studio Art,
- Computer Science,
- Engineering,
- French III and IV,
- Music Theory,
- Advanced Placement Psychology,
- Advanced Placement Environmental Science,
- Academic Challenges, and
- Teen Court.

# Tutoring and Intervention Programs

- The general M&O override also funds tutoring and other intervention programs to serve students throughout the school year and into the summer.
- These programs include items such as the PATH Program at Amphi High and the licensing of intervention software.
- This provided for 1.1 FTE, in addition to, funding additional hours for tutoring.





## Employee Compensation Enhancement

- The override provides additional funding to enhance compensation for certificated and classified personnel in the District.
- This allows the District to remain competitive to hire the best teachers for our students.
- It also allows the District to compete against private employers and charter schools to obtain trained professional staff.





### Employee Compensation Enhancement

- The 10% Maintenance and Operations override funds approximately *3% of almost every employee salary* in the District.
- This includes:
  - Classified (Hourly) employees,
  - Certificated employees, and
  - Administrative employees.
- For SY 2019-2020, the 10% Maintenance and Operations budget override provides \$2.6 million dollars in compensation/salary enhancements for District employees.





# Positions Funded Entirely by the 10% M&O Override

- The 10% M&O override adds technology and facilities positions to enable the District to remain current with technology changes and growing technology demands.
- These following positions are funded 100% by the M&O override:
  - 2 Maintenance Tech II positions in the Facilities Department, and
  - 1 Programmer Analyst in the Technology Department.
