2. 2022 Tax Levy – One month ago I provided an in-depth analysis of the levy request. Tonight, I am providing a synopsis of the levy request. The EAV from Shelby County had a significant increase since I last presented the Tentative Levy in November. Due to the increase, I had to make some adjustments in order to keep us below the Truth in Taxation threshold. The recommended levy dollar amounts have increased due to the higher EAV in all categories with the exception of Tort, which has been decreased by \$29,860.87. This will not pose a problem due to the healthy fund balance currently in the Tort Fund.

In summary, I am recommending an increase of 4.98% from the previous year. This amounts to a 6.84% (including Bond + Interest) increase with this year's tax levy and this recommended increase amounts to \$438,132. If the projections hold true this would translate into \$248,890 new dollars for the Education Fund, \$48,802 new dollars for the Operation and Maintenance (Building) Fund, and \$19,520 for the Transportation Fund. This would be a total increase of \$317,212 in the three primary operating funds. Overall, this actually will decrease the tax rate by \$0.03 from a year ago if the projections hold true.

A new requirement this year is that during the tax levy presentation a District must review the current year opening fund balances. The following were the final audited fund balances that we began the current fiscal year with as of 7/1/22.

Education Fund (10): \$13,037,627

Operations and Maintenance (20): \$786,963

Debt Service (30): \$768,264 Transportation (40): \$527,162

Municipal Retirement / Social Security (50): \$594, 361

Capital Projects (60): \$1,425,162 Working Cash (70): \$2,367,653

Tort (80): \$1,017,138

Fire Prevention and Safety (90): \$234,742

3. Resolution abating the taxes heretofore levied for the year 2022 to pay debt service on the General Obligation School Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source), Series 2019, of Community Unit School District Number 8, Christian, Shelby and Montgomery Counties, Illinois – This will become a regular occurrence until the alternate revenue bond principal and interest is paid off. The abatement resolution is necessary and needs to be passed by the Board and delivered to the County Clerk prior to the end of February 2023 in order to prevent property taxes from being collected during the 2023 calendar year for the bond issue. The 1% sales tax revenue has been pledged to pay for this bond over the next 3 years. This is year 4 of 5.
