Since all 7th grade students attend the trip, teachers repeat the two days of curriculum(same information is covered Tuesday and Thursday/Wednesday and Friday). This format means that they will not have any work to make up unless they are in 8th grade math or classes at SHS.

Description of the educational expectations/correlation to the classroom curriculum associated with this trip: While at Camp students participate in 6 small group activities including:

- Nature Hike This has a tie to the SIS science curriculum.

 It reviews topics from 6th grade science as well introducing topics that will be covered in 7th grade science.
- Canoeing This has a tie to the PE curriculum. Students are introduced to water and canoe safety, the correct method for paddling a canoe and then allowed time to be physically active and practice these skills.
- Plant Ninjas This has a tie to the SIS science curriculum.

 Our first unit of the year has a botany focus and this

- activity reviews the vocabulary associated with the different types of plants.
- Letter Boxing This has a ties to the SIS World Geography curriculum. Students are given handheld GPS units and asked to use latitude and longitude readings to find hidden caches in camp.
- Cooperation This has ties to the SIS PBIS curriculum.

 Students are asked to work together to write a skit that they will perform out at camp. This activity really asks students to get to know their peers and work together for an authentic audience. This helps bring together students from the different elementary school.
- Team Challenge This has ties to the SIS PBIS curriculum.

 Students are asked to work together to play capture the flag.

 This activity really asks students to get to know their peers and work together to accomplish a task. This helps bring together students from the different elementary school.

Describe your discipline plan: Clear expectations that are explained to the student and their families prior to the trip, removal from activity (or activities) until the situation has been mediated or handled, in extreme circumstances the student will be sent home from camp.

- Parents will turn in all student medication and one teacher will be responsible for making sure all necessary medication is taken.
- We will coordinate with the District Nurse and SIS Health Aide to make sure we are aware of all student health concerns.
- As authorized on their permission slips, students will be responsible for carrying their epi-pens and inhalers in a string backpack. All staff will be given a list of students that should have a string backpack and a brief description of when they might need to use it.
