


Reversing the Slide

In 2022, Graduating HS Seniors in our service area were eligible for up to 7 credit hours of summer tuition through a program called Reversing the Slide. Paid by Collin College's CARES funding, the unique program offered multiple benefits to our students and the community.

Reversing the Slide Outcomes

- 1,300 students took advantage almost doubling the FTF enrollment from the previous summer
- Provides Collin College with multiple new Success Point funding opportunities
 - Reverse Transfers
 - Completion of Math, Reading and Writing Requirements
 - Crossing 15-hour and 30-hour ranges
 - 12 students completed their Core, an academic certificate or associate degree that summer
 - Transfer credits (Dual credit students don't count but First-Time Freshmen do)
- ISD partners shared with us that it increased their College, Career and Military Readiness (CCMR) points

Reversing the Slide Outcomes

- 260 students only took these courses (i.e. no prior dual credit and no enrollment in fall 2022)
- 511 students previously had dual credit plus this summer but did not continue on at Collin College in Fall 2022
 - Considered new credit hours due to the program
- Collin College would now be eligible for potential transfer success points on these students

Financial Estimates Based on Summer 2022

Net Result:

Very positive community outreach program that turned out net positive for award attainment, enrollment growth, and financial reimbursement.

Summer 2023 Reversing the Slide Program

- Summer 2023: CARES funding would cover an estimated \$450,000 tuition costs for students
 - Amount of credit will be capped at \$450,000

Eligibility:

- Must be in-district student (or in-district high school)
- Graduated HS spring of same year
- Apply through P-12 partnerships office prior to class beginning.
- Award for up to six hours for Summer I or Summer III classes
- Data will be provided to the Board of Trustees in 2023-2024 showing to comparison years
