Have a wonderful summer and we look forward to seeing you next year.





The Aubrey AG Department has had another amazing year! The Aubrey FFA Chapter consisted of over 100 active members led by 8 chapter officers. Miss Hailey White represented Aubrey as a District FFA Officer within our local district. We had over 45 students showing more than 60 animals at more than 10 livestock shows around the state as well as the country.

In the fall, the FFA members started the year off with their first round of competitions. The Leadership Development Events were a huge success. The Jr. Skills team, Jr. Quiz Team, and our Jr. Creed Speaker all advanced to the area contest. This was the all time best for the junior teams. Ivana Gharbi, 8th grade, represented Aubrey as our Jr. Creed speaker through the District/Area and ended up 11th overall at the state contest in Huntsville. This state qualification also allows Ivana to obtain her letterman as a freshman in the fall. We are very excited for her! In the late fall we collected over 412 blankets for the needy through the Hope Ministries. We were then able to distribute them to community members who needed them.

With the close of fall and start of a new calendar year brings the start to our livestock show season. As a chapter we attended the Ft. Worth Stock Show, San Antonio Livestock Show, and the San Angelo Stock Show. Other students chose to attend more shows on their own and did very well. Ethan Saye traveled over 50,000 miles in the last year showing his Beefmaster Heifers. Ethan has also won National merits at numerous shows this last year. He takes his project very seriously and it truly pays off!

Hard work was evident this year. Last year was great, but this year seems to just be a tad bit better. At the Ft. Worth show we drove home 2 Breed Champions, 2 Division Champions and 12 animals in the top ten of placing. At the San Antonio show we did similar work with 1 breed champion and 8 placing in the top ten. In San Angelo we placed as a Division winner with our flatbed trailer and 2 students walked away as Division Champions. Denton County Fair was another great accomplishment for us this year. We placed with 4 Grand Champion projects, 4 Reserve Grand Champion projects, 5 Grand Champion Showmanship's, 15 animal projects in the sale and over 30 students place in the top 6 placing! As well, our students worked very hard at the Career Development Events at Texas A&M Commerce on the poultry judging and livestock teams and placed in the top 50 (out of 100+ teams). I would say that's a good show season!

As the stock show season came to a close this, Aubrey FFA held their annual livestock show and sale. This was such a great event for our students and the community. Through this event, we were able to give back \$30,200.00 to the student's future livestock projects. As well, our FFA students worked very hard for our graduating seniors and were able to host a scholarship raffle that raised over \$6000.00 for qualifying graduates. Combined over \$36,200.00 was raised for our FFA members. In closing I must say we are very proud of our students in Aubrey FFA, they truly are the leaders of tomorrow.


