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

Borman, Cross Oaks, N.Rayzor, Paloma Creek, Stephens were not included since they house Pre-K programs.

This assumes each elementary campus will be associated with only one Pre-K campus. Multiple option from each elementary campus Significantly increases the number of buses needed

Capital Needed \$1,541,918


M/O Needed \$448,000

This reflects purchasing 14 buses, 28 additional staff.



Door To Door

Denton ISD – 180 Sq Miles

Pre-K 2mile	234	18	36

Under ideal circumstances we can accomplish a door to door service for 15 Students within an hour. The further the route has to travel between the campus and the students' resident the student load numbers decease in order to stay within the one hour window.

Capital Needed \$2,005,866 M/O Needed \$576,000 This reflects purchasing 18 buses, 36 additional staff, 234 car seats



Summary

Method	Capital	M/O
1. Corner Stops	\$1,234,907	\$352,000
2. Campus to Campus	\$1,541,918	\$448,000
3. Door to Door	\$2,005,866	\$576,000

This report is grounded in the actual Pre-K population for the 2011 -2012 School year. Any kind of growth was not included in this initial report. However we can work with our demographers to see if we can pin point future levels of Pre-K student populations.





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
