#### HOLD IN PLACE

A situation INSIDE the building that requires immediate action for all to stay put.

This is non-life threatening.

#### **SECURE THE BUILDING & TEACH**

There is a situation OUTSIDE the building that requires all persons to remain inside the building.

### **EVACUATION**

#### **SEVERE WEATHER**

Severe weather that has the potentia to cause structural damage.



- Active shooter training for staff (RHD)
- Safety Week September 15th-19th
  - Safety video each day of the week for students and parents
- Create a district safety committee
- Upgrade vestibules at each building
  - Move visitor system into the vestibule
  - New video intercom
