After speaking with you last week, I am submitting to you this letter expressing my interest in the Principal position at Waskom Middle School.

As a professional, I find motivation in my passion for education. Even now as I am working with the elementary principal to design an intervention plan for struggling students, I find the same issues and opportunities that I experienced with the older kids. My invaluable experiences at OCISD working with all grade levels have prepared me to be effective at any level.

Personally, I am defined by my loyalty to students, staff, and the integrity of the educational system; by my willingness to work diligently and learn quickly; by my deep personal commitment to student achievement; and by my capacity to find the best in others as we work toward common goals.
