For Late start or total school closure:

If a decision is made to delay or close school the district office follows these steps to notify parents:

- Post on District Facebook page—<u>Neah Kah Nie School District #56</u>
- Activate School Messenger This system calls all families It is important to keep your phone numbers up to date - Baring any internet issues this process should be completed by 6:15 a.m

For Early Dismissal For Nehalem: (weather alerts, power outage etc.)

- If we have power, the office will activate School messenger to notify families that school is closing early and approximate times students will arrive home and the District Office will post on flashnews.
- Principal will post on NKN Facebook.
- IF no power, the office must use what parents provided for emergency school closure—please make sure this is up to date.
- Office will also send email to all families who have provided a valid email.

NEHALEM POOL

Because of E Coli, Cryptosporidia, Giardia, and other organisms that can make people very ill, we need to ask parents and students help in following these guidelines put out by the Oregon Health Division:

If a swimmer has had diarrhea in the past two weeks, he or she should not swim. Swimmers who may have bowel accidents must wear a special swim diaper. All swimmers must take a cleansing shower before entering the pool and after using the toilet. As you probably know, these diseases can be very serious, so we must be able to count on our students to follow these rules, and parents to help reinforce their importance.
