Subject: Proposal for 2013 student trip to Spain

The itinerary and cost of the trip is included on the attached sheet.



DAY 1: OVERNIGHT FLIGHT Depart from the USA

DAY 2: BARCELONA Arrive in Barcelona, Spain's second-largest city and capital of Catalonia. The rest of the day is free to explore this bustling city


