2025-2026 GSRP Demographics: We served 305 children for the 2025-2026 school year across 5 districts and 16 classrooms. Belding served 36 school day allocations. Saranac served 18 school day allocations. Ionia served 70 extended day allocations. Lakewood served 36 school day allocations. Portland served 18 school day allocations and 83 extended day allocations. Head Start served 34 Head start blend allocations.

Child outcome data for Fall 2025–Spring 2026 shows that children are demonstrating expected growth across all developmental domains. Benchmark attainment ranged from 91% to 99%, with the strongest performance observed in Language and Physical Development. Literacy showed the greatest overall growth gains. Cognitive Development, while meeting expectations, had the lowest benchmark attainment and will remain an area of focus for continuous improvement efforts. Overall program outcomes reflect strong progress and positive child development trends.

2026-2027 GSRP Demographic Projection: We are planning to serve additional allocations for the 2026-2027 school year. Currently, we are increasing in Belding by one classroom with 18 school day allocations, as well as increasing in Ionia by one classroom with 18 extended day allocations. As of now, all five districts have their own 1755 coach to support the increase in student needs. County wide, we currently have 21 students enrolled who have 1755 support written in their IEP, and 20 students with IEP's.
