REPORTS

Bias Incident Response Protocol, Lori Dilbeck, Angie Douma and Denise Weiss Ms. Dilbeck, along with Ms. Douma and Ms. Weiss presented the middle school Bias Incident Response Protocol. Their presentation is attached to these minutes.

Ms. Dilbeck stated that OAR 581-022-2312 is what guided the board toward our Every Student Belongs and our bias Incident Complaint process. Ms. Dilbeck reviewed the process they use if they receive a bias incident complaint. They assemble their team; investigate by conducting interviews; Plan by reviewing the interview data and consulting with NWRESD Safety & Prevention Specialist and begin safety and support planning to prevent further harm, and then a response is developed.

Ms. Aeder shared that she is glad that they access NWRESD. Our equity committee began 3.5 years ago and Neah-Kah-Nie was one of the first to form such a committee.

Ms. Fleisher asked if the process has been used often. Ms. Dilbeck stated that they have used the process six times this year. Mr. Wantland stated that the middle school has a great team. It needs to be a learning moment in order to help people grow and move along.

Ms. Scalabrin asked if this process is a result of the equity committee. Are staff and students being trained on the why? Dr. Reed stated that we have to give our kids some real credit in their ability to understand each other. We want our staff, parents and students to feel and be safe.

Ms. Bayouth-Real thanked the middle school for taking the ideas from the Inclusion Alliance committee, she is also glad that they are connecting with ODE and NWRESD. Does the team have the availability of implicit bias training? Ms. Weiss stated that there are different licenses that require training and some have sought out the training on their own.







Board Policy Every Student Belongs All students are entitled to a high quality educational experience, free from discrimination or harasment based on perceived race, color, religion, gender identity, sexual orientation, disability or national origin. Bias Incident Complaint The district will use administrative regulation ACB-AR - Bias Incident Complaint Procedure to process reports or complaints of bias incidents.

Process		
01	Assemble	When a report is made, the team gathers to document the report and review the process.
02	Investigate	The team interviews the person impacted, the person who caused harm, and witnesses.
03	Plan	The team reviews interview data, consults with NWRESD Safety & Prevention Specialist and begins safety and support planning to prevent further harm.
04	Respond	Prioritize non-punitive remedial measures focused on education for the person who caused harm, continue support for persons harmed, and provide written notification to parents of students impacted.
