Principal's Remarks:

- The Beaverton School District will place a 5-year Local Option Levy on the May ballot. Stacie has been investigating the rules for distributing information and gathering support from our school and community. Some of the ideas discussed include distributing approved flyers, wearing buttons of support, having an information booth setup at the Science Fair, and getting people involved in canvassing. The first canvassing event is scheduled for April 7th from 4:00-7:00.
