BOARD'S CONSTRAINTS FOR THE SUPERINTENDENT

- The superintendent will not allow the absence rate to increase or remain the same.
- The superintendent will not allow any campuses to have inequitable access to effective staff.
- The superintendent will not propose a change of use for a functioning campus unless the board has adopted a long-term facilities plan that is developed by a structured process for gathering and incorporating the community's values and ideas.

BOARD'S CONSTRAINTS FOR THE BOARD

- The Board collectively or Trustees individually will not perform or appear to perform any of the roles delegated to the Superintendent.
- The Board will not allow the introduction of new information or materials related agenda items once the agenda is posted.
- The Board's discussion on any agenda item shall not exceed
 14 minutes with each Trustee allowed 2 minutes of comments.
- The Board will review and amend its operating procedures once a year.

GOALS

- The percentage of graduates who will qualify for community college/university, military, or industry certification will increase from 62% to 85% for graduating class of 2022.
- The percent of students who perform at the masters grade level standard (formerly Level III) for all grades in state mathematics exams will increase from 8% to 40% by the year 2022.
- The percent of students who perform at the masters grade level standard (formerly Level III) for all grades in state reading exams will increase from 9% to 45% by the year 2022.
