

NCSD Standards-Based Reporting Implementation Plan

Goal:

To refine and enhance K-3 Standards-Based Reporting (SBR) using feedback before expanding to 4th and 5th grade, ensuring a smooth transition and continuous improvement.

Phase 1: Feedback Collection (Current School Year)

✓ **Step 1:** Teacher staff inservice day to discuss current Essential standards, consider making any changes.

✓ **Step 2: Parent Survey** – C&I creates and distributes a survey on Standards-Based Report Cards (SBRC) and the inclusion of objectives (March 2025).

✓ **Step 3: Analyze Feedback** – Collect and review survey responses and feedback from town halls to identify strengths, concerns, and areas for improvement.

✓ **Step 4: Refine K-3 SBR** – Use findings to enhance the clarity, effectiveness, and communication of K-3 standards-based reporting.

Phase 2: Implementation & Refinement (Next School Year)

✓ **Step 5: School Community Town Hall Meetings (August/September 2025)** – At the start of the school year, the curriculum team will host town hall meetings to:

- Inform families about Standards-Based Reporting (SBR).
- Explain the purpose and benefits of SBR.
- Answer questions and address concerns.
- Gather initial feedback from families.

✓ **Step 6:** Implement updates to K-3 report cards based on feedback and provide professional development for teachers.

✓ **Step 7:** Continue gathering feedback from parents and teachers through surveys and discussions(roundtables/town hall meetings).

✓ **Step 8** Revisit and refine K-3 reporting based on ongoing input, ensuring improvements align with student learning needs.

Phase 3: Expansion to 4th and 5th Grade (Future Consideration)

✓ **Step 9:** Evaluate the success of K-3 SBR implementation and determine readiness for expansion.

✓ **Step 10:** Make necessary refinements and prepare 4th-grade teachers and parents for the transition.

School Community Town Hall Meetings (August/September 2026) – At the start of the school year, the curriculum team will host town hall meetings to:

- Inform families about Standards-Based Reporting (SBR).
- Explain the purpose and benefits of SBR.
- Answer questions and address concerns.
- Gather initial feedback from families.

✓ **Step 11:** Roll out Standards-Based Report Cards in 4th and 5th grade, continuing to gather feedback for future improvements.
