5th Grade

The 5th graders are very busy this month. They are taking the "Stay Safe" program on Mondays. They are learning about how to protect themselves from bullying and drugs.

ELAR classes are studying:

- Greek & Latin affixes, multiple meaning words, and dictionary and glossary skills.
- Inference & drawing conclusions
- Summary & point of view
- Writing process for persuasive, nonfiction writings

Science classes are learning about types of energy we use which include:

- Mechanical
- Thermal
- Light
- Sound
- Electrical

Math classes are working on all operations and fractions.

Social Studies classes are using the Studies Weekly program.

8th Grade

English are focusing on Grammar and Writing to master writing concise extended responses.

Science classes have finished their last unit in Chemistry. They will be reviewing and quizzing each other on this until the STAAR in May.

Math classes are learning about slope, slope-intercept form, direct variation, y-intercept, proportional and non-proportional linear equations.

6th Grade
