BACKGROUND: The H-E-B Trees for Texans: For Communities program, created by Texan by Nature and H-E-B, awards \$5,000 to nonprofits, schools, municipalities, and civic groups for tree-planting projects. These projects expand tree canopy, add shade to reduce urban heat, enhance green spaces, and beautify public areas across Texas, creating healthier environments. Brownsville ISD applied to plant 20 native trees: 10 at Burns Elementary and 10 at Del Castillo—Morningside Elementary. With current canopy coverage of 10–13%, these campuses will benefit from

Trees for Texans - Grant Application

Program Details: Applicants from across Texas are invited to apply for a \$5,000 grant for projects that increase tree canopy, reduce heat island effect, increase available greenspace, and beautify public spaces. Projects must be publicly accessible and include a care and maintenance plan for post-project longevity. While project types are not strictly prescribed, projects must generate verifiable impact. (ie: community seedling giveaways are highly unlikely to be selected). The goal of this program is to utilize funding from the H-E-B Trees for Texans program to generate measurable positive impact on natural resources across the state of Texas, improving the communities in which H-E-B employees and customers live, work, and play.

Award Amount: \$5,000

Grant Funder: H-E-B Trees for Texans program

Application Submission Period: November 1, 2024 - May 30, 2025

Notification of Award: July 2025

Project Completion Deadline: At this time, funding will be awarded for plantings occurring in the 2025-2026 planting season (October 2025-March 2026). Please note in your application if your project will not be complete by this time.

Application Materials: Applicants must complete the application form in its entirety for their application to be considered submitted and eligible for consideration. If you would like to work on your application prior to submission (the form will not let you save progress) you may download a Word version HERE: <u>Application - Word Version</u>. Please note, the Word version is for your personal use only - applications MUST be submitted via this form!

Eligible Organizations: Nonprofit organizations, government organizations, and municipalities are eligible to apply for this program.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Organizations must maintain a valid 501c3 nonprofit status as designated by the IRS in order to
 receive donations from the H-E-B Trees for Texans program OR be a valid municipality or
 governmental organization. Schools are also eligible to apply. Community organizations wishing to
 take part must partner with one of these types of organizations to be eligible. Individual landowners
 on private lands and for-profit corporations are not eligible.
- Application for support must be received via the online application form within the designated application period in order to be considered for the relevant granting cycle.
- Regardless of previous grant awards, organizations must reapply online every year if they wish to be considered for funding.

- H-E-B Trees for Texans does not support funding for advertising, individuals, general operating expenses, school trips, sports events, teams, political events, or third-party fundraisers.
- All applicants must provide a care plan for their project for post-planting care and maintenance. Funding from the grant may be spent on irrigation/care as needed.
- All selected projects must fill out a post-project report detailing the final impact of the project.
 Projects are to be completed by the end of the calendar year.

Project History & Background

How did the project start? What was the catalyst? If this is a new initiative, what lead to its formation?

The 25-26 Brownsville ISD Reforestation Project will be part of an ongoing initiative to plant trees at all BISD schools. Since the 2022-2023 school year, 358 trees have been planted in 18 schools. If the Trees for Texans grant is awarded, two elementary schools will receive trees to provide much-needed shade for students during their outdoor play (recess) and serve as an on-site learning resource. This initiative aligns with the district's commitment to sustainability and student well-being by addressing heat exposure while incorporating environmental education. By enhancing green spaces, the project promotes hands-on learning opportunities and fosters environmental awareness among students, ensuring long-term benefits for both the school community and the surrounding environment.

Project Goals & Objectives

What is the purpose of the project? What needs are being met? What are the goals? How are you achieving them?

Purpose of the Project

The project aims to improve outdoor learning spaces and provide necessary shade for students while they play. By planting trees at two elementary schools, the project seeks to enhance student comfort, promote environmental awareness, and support sustainability efforts within the district.

Needs Being Met

This project addresses several key needs within the school community. It helps reduce heat exposure for students during outdoor activities, creating a safer and more comfortable play environment. It also provides hands-on learning opportunities in environmental education, allowing students to engage with nature and understand the importance of trees in urban ecosystems.

Goals

The primary goal of the project is to plant trees at two elementary schools to integrate the tree planting into the curriculum, helping students learn about sustainability, ecology, and the benefits of trees. Another important goal is to encourage student involvement in environmental stewardship, promoting a sense of responsibility for the world.

How We Are Achieving Them

The project will be accomplished by carefully selecting native tree species that provide ample shade and are well-suited to the local climate. Collaboration with city, school staff and students, and community partners will ensure successful planting and long-term maintenance of the trees.

Brownsville, Texas, experiences high temperatures throughout much of the year, with average highs exceeding 90°F in spring and summer. Many BISD elementary schools have limited tree coverage, leaving students exposed to direct sunlight during recess and outdoor learning activities. By strategically planting trees at these two elementary schools, this project will help create cooler outdoor spaces for students, mitigate the effects of urban heat, and foster environmental stewardship within their community, ensuring a lasting positive impact.

While the 25-26 Brownsville ISD Reforestation Project is primarily focused on enhancing student well-being and environmental education, it also offers broader community benefits that can contribute to economic incentives. By increasing green spaces on school campuses, the project helps improve the overall aesthetic appeal of the area, which can positively impact property values and neighborhood desirability.

Project Impact - Does this project provide ecosystem services?

The 25-26 Brownsville ISD Reforestation Project provides valuable ecosystem services by reducing the urban heat island effect, improving air quality, and managing stormwater runoff. The planted trees will help lower temperatures, filter pollutants, prevent soil erosion, and support biodiversity by creating habitats for local wildlife. It will also serve as a hands-on learning resource, allowing students to better understand the role of trees in sustaining ecosystems. Through these benefits, the project promotes a healthier, more sustainable environment for both the school and the community.

What other natural resources are benefitted by the project?

Examples include types of plants, wildlife, waterways, habitat areas, etc.

The 25-26 Brownsville ISD Reforestation Project will benefit natural resources by improving soil health, conserving water, and supporting local wildlife. The trees will help reduce erosion, enhance groundwater recharge, and provide habitat for birds, pollinators, and small mammals. Additionally, they will improve air quality by filtering pollutants and capturing carbon dioxide while promoting biodiversity on school campuses. Through these efforts, the project strengthens the local ecosystem and contributes to a more sustainable environment.

Project Impact - Does this project help the community save money? If so, how? * Please provide data where possible.

Since public schools are funded through federal, state, and local taxes, these savings will allow more funds to be directed toward students' education rather than energy consumption, ultimately benefiting the learning environment and overall school resources. Having said this, the 25-26 Brownsville ISD Reforestation Project will help the community save money by reducing energy costs, improving stormwater management, and enhancing public health. In Brownsville, Texas, where summer temperatures often exceed 90°F, trees provide natural shade that can lower air conditioning costs by up to 30%. They will also help lower infrastructure maintenance costs, as a mature tree can absorb up to 3,000 gallons of water per year. Additional savings may result from improved air quality, as increased tree cover can lead to fewer respiratory issues, potentially reducing healthcare expenses.

BISD has a dedicated department responsible for ensuring schools follow proper tree care practices. Their staff visits schools weekly during the first year and bimonthly thereafter, with non-compliance addressed with the campus principal and area superintendent. Schools are responsible for watering, while the district maintenance department manages mulching, pruning, and aerating the soil to maintain tree health. Additionally, the district curriculum department integrates tree education into lesson plans, promoting sustainability and environmental awareness among students.

With an average cost of \$250 per tree, the project will allow for 20 trees to be purchased. If BISD secures a better price, more trees will be purchased. The district will cover the cost of mulch, water hoses, and other necessary materials. BISD will also handle site preparation and maintenance to support the trees' survival to maturity.






Is there anything else you would like to share?

Personal comment: As a parent of a district alum, I was unaware of where my child played until I looked at aerial images of his elementary school. It was disappointing to see that my son's school, as well as many others, lacks shaded areas for students to play. This issue became even more important when BISD approved a recess policy in February 2024, allowing all elementary students, from pre-kindergarten through fifth grade, to have recess. Tree planting has become necessary, as it will provide cooler, safer, and more comfortable outdoor spaces for students to play and learn. By planting more trees, we are not just improving schoolyards; we are investing in the future of our children.



Attached please find the Grant Agreement between Brownsville ISD and H-E-B to support and fund the district's reforestation initiative at two elementary campuses during the 2025-2026 school year.
