#### **Board Goal:**

Domain 3 - Growth & Management

- Demonstrate effective and efficient management of district resources
- Provide leadership and/or oversight to ensure District meets all fiscal, legal and regulatory requirements.

#### **Purpose of Report:**

The purpose of this report is to provide the Board of Trustees with a summary of Denton ISD's current enrollment count, including connected learners and face-to-face learner's enrollment data, for the 2020–2021 school year and to compare this data to previous years.

#### **Objective:**

The objective is to closely monitor the enrollment numbers and overall growth in student population at each Denton ISD campus and to provide support and resources where needed.

#### **Operational Impact:**

The analysis of Denton ISD's enrollment data allows the district to ensure that all campuses remain in compliance with state class size requirements. It also allows the district to ensure that plans are developed to meet current and future needs of the district.

#### **Results**

Denton ISD's 2020 10-day count was 29,880 and our current enrollment is 30,169. When compared to enrollment on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of school, Denton ISD has enrolled another 289 students in this current school year. When compared to 2019-2020 school year's PEIMS submission data, Denton ISD currently has 504 fewer students enrolled. 11<sup>th</sup> grade enrollment count increased by 103 students, followed by 12<sup>th</sup> grade with 96 students. Pre-K enrollment decreased by 197 students, followed by 5<sup>th</sup> grade with 183 students.

The current enrollment for elementary is 13,730 students, 4,963 students are connected learners and 8,767 students are face-to-face learners. The current enrollment for secondary is 16,439 students, 6,695 students are connected learners and 9,744 students are face-to-face learners.

Across the four largest racial/ethnic groups in Denton ISD for the 2020-2021 school year, enrollment increased from the previous year for African American students (90), and decreased for Asian students (81), Hispanic students (58), and White students (910).

The district saw a reduction with the number of students enrolled in all areas except ESL and CTE programs. Currently campus LPAC committees are identifying Pre-K and Kindergarten students for enrollment into the Bilingual and ESL program. This process typically runs through the month of September. The largest enrollment growth was in Career & Technology Education with an increase of 1,452 students followed by ESL an increase of 145 students when compared to last school year. We saw a reduction in Denton ISD's Bilingual program (255), Gifted & Talented program (207), and Special Education program (84).

We currently have 14,159 students who qualify for the free or reduced lunch program, with 12,076 students qualifying for free lunch and 2,083 students qualifying for reduced lunch. When compared to last school year's PEIMS submission data, Denton ISD's economically disadvantaged students decreased by 492 students.

Denton ISD ended the 2019-2020 school year with 30,673 students enrolled. When comparing enrollment data from last school year to where we are in this current school year, below is a look at Denton ISD campuses with the largest growth or reduction in enrollment numbers thus far:

#### The district enrolled 611 fewer elementary students this school year.

- Union Park Elementary enrolled 260 more students this school year, followed by Ginnings Elementary with 24 more students.
  - Union Park Elementary has the largest enrollment with 717 students, followed by Cross Oaks Elementary with 666 students.
- Hawk Elementary enrolled 102 fewer students this school year, followed by Hodge Elementary with 85 fewer students.
  - EP Rayzor Elementary has the smallest enrollment with 311 students, followed by Stephens Elementary with 375 students.

#### The district enrolled 118 fewer middle school students this school year.

- Rodriguez Middle School enrolled 67 more students this school year, followed by Navo Middle School with 49 more students.
  - Navo Middle School has the largest enrollment with 1,039 students, followed by Rodriguez Middle School with 954 students.
- Calhoun Middle School enrolled 52 fewer students this school year.
  - Calhoun Middle School has the smallest enrollment with 671 students.

#### The district enrolled 225 more high school students this school year.

- Stasswell enrolled 109 more students this school year, followed by Ryan with 35 more students.
  - Guyer has the largest enrollment with 2,635 students.
  - While all of the High School campuses had growth in enrolled students, Denton High School has the smallest enrollment with 2,024 students.

# In total, the district has enrolled 504 fewer students this current school year, when compared to last school year.
