Background The USDA has implemented a requirement for the costs of meals to be Information: more in line with the Federal reimbursement rates by calculating the number of paid lunches served as compared to an average of all District lunch prices. This is called the "Weighted Average Price".

The districts required weighted average price for SY 2024-25 is \$3.36.

Increasing the price by \$0.05 on each campus increases the 2025-2026 Weighted Average Price for NISD is \$ 3.41 and maintains compliance with USDA requirements.

As an information item, the paid student breakfast price district-wide will increase by \$0.25, bringing the total cost to \$1.50 per breakfast meal. This is the first increase in over 13 years, and even with this adjustment, our breakfast price remains lower than those neighboring districts that charge for breakfast. We remain committed to providing students with nutritious, balanced meals each day, and this modest increase helps us continue meeting rising food and operational costs while maintaining high-quality service.

The board is only required to approve the school lunch price. But we

wanted to make the Board aware of the planned increase in the breakfast price.
