### Beavers break down dams for low-income students

One way College Possible increases impact is by partnering with local colleges and universities to provide fully-funded campus visits to low-income students. Oregon State University is the most recent Explore Partner, delivering on their mission to ensure college is open to all Oregonians.

"Oregon State University has a history of educating first-generation students and understanding the resources and attention that are needed for them to receive an education and the experiential learning opportunities that will lead to graduation and prepare them for careers," explains Dr. Ilene Kleinsorge, Dean of the College of Business at OSU.

Thirty-seven College Possible students visited the OSU campus in November, and for many it was their first time on a college campus. Allison, a junior at Sam Barlow High School,



reflects on her experience, "I like how it feels like home, as well as the welcoming attitude you get from students and faculty".

College partnerships are vital to the success of our students, and Oregon State University is helping to pave the way. Dr. Kleinsorge explains why these partnerships are important to the university, too. "Moving away from home, finding the resources to attend college and integrating into a new community can be overwhelming for any student but when there are organizations like College Possible, we can work together to assure a student's success is a win-win for everyone."

# Department of Education invests in College Possible


College Possible has received its largest grant ever, which will allow us to multiply our impact in the coming years!

The US Department of Education is awarding College Possible a \$3 million grant from its "Investing in Innovation" (i3) competition, which is aimed at developing innovative approaches to improving student achievement.

The five-year i3 grant will support

programming in Portland high schools and nationally and evaluate the impact of College Possible coaching on students' motivation, persistence and resilience.

"These programs are changing the landscape of education in this country by supporting innovative ideas and scaling up what works," said Secretary of Education Arne Duncan. "This round of i3 grantees is poised to have real impact in areas of critical need."

This year, I resolve that we change that statistic forever.

With the odds seemingly stacked against them, College Possible Portland students are full of hope for a better future and are working tirelessly to turn that hope into action. Our first-ever graduating class of seniors has spent their winter break working to complete countless scholarship and college applications, including Kaylee, from David Douglas High School who has applied to nine colleges!

This winter, their hard work is already starting to payoff in the form of that coveted acceptance letter. College Possible Portland students have received over 85 acceptances to 25 colleges across the country including a significant first: our first student admitted to college from Portland earned a scholarship to Harvard University. In fact, Josh is the first student in College Possible's history to



earn admission to Harvard

In addition to Josh we have so much to be proud of in Portland. So far, our students have earned admission to Colorado College, Oregon State University, Pomona College, Portland State University and Willamette University, among many others.

As our students are working hard to create a brighter future for themselves and their families, I want to thank you for providing your hope and support, and giving them the opportunity to succeed.
