



Students in Ms.

Sandgren's 4th grade class, as part of a persuasive writing unit, came up with the idea of a student leadership team.















Students filled out applications to show that they were interested in being part of the team. Any student that wanted to be involved was invited to join!








Students started with what we love and hope for Sacramento, and then narrowed it down to four problems that they want to change!


- We need more ways for kids to connect across the school.

- We need more chances to learn out in the community.


















On the April 21 professional development day, teachers worked to take an upcoming math standard and incorporate play, art, and collaboration within their lesson.
