AGENDA ITEM: Report Item - Foreign Exchange Student Waiver

ALIGNS TO BOARD PRIORITY:

 Learning – The District will provide an aligned, rigorous, curriculum, with instructional and technology programs preparing students to meet or exceed all educational standards.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

- The following information is being presented in order to keep the Board informed of AISD foreign exchange student enrollment practices and options. Guidelines for enrolling foreign exchange students are located in FD(LEGAL).
- Annually, foreign exchange student programs promote Aledo ISD as an option for placing students from other countries. Aledo ISD acknowledges and appreciates that exchange student programs offer valuable enrichment experiences for the exchange students, as well as the students in our district.
- Currently, Aledo ISD accepts exchange student applications in both the fall and spring semester. On average, the District enrolls between five to eight exchange students each school year.
- Additionally, exchange student have never been required to take TAKS
 assessments unless the student intended to graduate from their host school.
 Beginning with STAAR End-of-Course exams, exchange students will now be
 required to take EOCs in all courses in which they are enrolled and where an
 EOC test is given. Allowing exchange students to enroll in the spring semester
 places the exchange student at a disadvantage in preparation for a STAAR EOC
 test due to the fact that the test is based on mastery of skills for an entire school
 year.
- In the May Board meeting, the district will seek approval from the Board to apply for a waiver with the Texas Education Agency to limit the number of foreign exchange students to no more than five per year. In addition, the waiver would

also allow the district to limit enrollment for exchange students to the fall semester only.

- The Texas Education Agency allows District's to request a foreign exchange student waiver for the following reasons:
 - The prospect of not limiting the number of exchange students could create a financial or staffing hardship for the district.
 - An unlimited number of exchange students could diminish the district's ability to provide high quality educational services for the district's domestic students, and may require domestic students to compete with exchange students for educational resources and services.
