Building Update

BMS Staff began working on a Hybrid Schedule on March 1st to March 15th. During that time, staff were assigned (by subject/content area) two days of inbuilding instruction and two days remote instruction, followed by the Friday schedule (remote) that we have been following all semester. It was SO good to have our staff back on campus, see their excitement over the new renovations and addition, and observe them working in their rooms.

After a full year, on March 22nd we were finally able to welcome students back to our BMS campus!!! Our "in-town" group attended March 22nd and 23rd, while our "out-of-town" group came on March 24th and 25th. It was evident that both staff and students were excited to once again be together. Seeing the face-to-face instruction taking place and witnessing the teacher-student and student-student interactions was uplifting and completely changed the feeling and environment of the once vacant building.

Although there were some minor mix-ups with scheduling and what days the students were to attend, the schedule flowed smoothly and arrivals/departures were a success.

Currently, construction on the building is complete, although there are still some "punch-list" items that still need to be addressed. TV's were ordered and are being installed for any rooms that didn't previously have them, and phones continue to be installed in some areas. Northwest Systems were on campus the first part of March working on our bell schedule, PA system/intercom set-up, and system training.

We are waiting on cupboards and countertops in BJA, and seating for the FACS and BJA areas (crescent tables and chairs).

The weight room and fitness area had the equipment moved from the bus garage and that equipment is now in the building and waiting for final installation. Three additional rows of seating of the bleachers still need to be installed which will take place this summer.

The new COVID19 signage for spacing, no social gathering, direction flow in the hallways, and cleaning/sanitizing reminders in the bathroom have been placed throughout the building, and both students and staff are doing a wonderful job following those protocols.
