Report Summary

School FIRST is a financial accountability rating system which benefits the public by having in place a system to ensure that school districts will be held accountable for the quality of their financial management practices and achieve improved performance in the management of their financial resources.

Using the School FIRST system, the Texas Education Agency (TEA) assigns each school district one of four financial accountability rating. The four ratings used are:

- A. Superior
- B. Above Standard
- C. Meets Standard
- D. Substandard Achievement
