

A NOTE FROM THE PRINCIPAL



Happy first week of November !

With the Governor's press conference last week and the newest changes to the Oregon Department of Educations safe school metrics, Neah-Kah-Nie School district is in the green zone- meaning that it is "safe" for us to start bringing students back to school. This will not happen immediately for all students but we are in the process of planning to make that happen.

We have already started engaging in Limited In Person Instruction. Each week we are expanding the number of students that are participating. Starting next week we will also be adding back the opportunity for students to participate in athletics and activities after school. All of these opportunities are based on signup requests and invitations because we have to maintain strict safety protocols and maintain a student contact log for contact tracing purposes. We also have to meet capacity limits for transportation.

Our school board meets on the second Monday each month. Next week's meeting will feature principals sharing our return to learn plans with the board.

We at the high school started planning for this last March. I would like you to know that the High School Plan has to be a hybrid model where half of the students come back to school in person two days per week, and the other half come a different two days in the week. The reason for this is that our classrooms are not large enough to accommodate all of our students at the same time and maintain a safe physical distancing as required with 35 square feet of space per person.

You should have received a survey yesterday sent out by the district asking among other things if you are able to provide transportation for your student once we return to in-person learning. Your answer is very important because it may impact our daily schedule. We may have to consider staggered start and end times to accommodate transportation needs.


