

#### **Early Childhood Family Education**

Parents and children learn and play together under the guidance of a licensed early childhood teacher/parent educator.

- Morning & afternoon sessions
- Latino ECFE class
- Classes offered year-round
- Located at Central with a class being offered in conjunction & at Westwood Nature Center
- Sliding fee scale. All families can participate regardless of ability to pay
- Help Us Grow (HUG) Home Visiting







Early Learning services conducts screenings (vision, hearing, developmental assessment) for St. Louis Park children to help identify children who may benefit from early childhood services before they enter school and connects them with the appropriate resources and programs. The ideal age is 3 - 4 years.

- Located in Central Early Learning Center - also provides services at offsite locations
- Screens approximately 400 children per year
- No cost to families

## **Early Learning Preschool**

Flexible, half day AM and PM preschool options for children ages 3-5.



- Inclusive and integrated classrooms
- Highly qualified teachers and paraprofessionals
- Tuition assistance available through
   Pathways II Scholarships and School
   Readiness funding including SRP available 24/25
- Transportation available to those who qualify





### Kids Place Preschool

Full day preschool options for children 33 months - 5 years.

- Open 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
- Inclusive and integrated classrooms
- Highly qualified teachers
- Ongoing enrollment
- Tuition assistance available through CCAP (Child Care Assistance Program) and Pathways I funding









- Open play/choice time
- Large group time
- Small group guided instruction
- Art, music, and dramatic play
- Curriculum guided literacy, math, and science activities
- Gym and large motor play time
- Snack



#### Curriculum

Big Day for PreK curriculum has a strong literacy base and the curriculums monthly themes align well with the IB planners at our elementary schools.

Bridges in Mathematics. Hands on activities that focus on multiple pathways to solving problems, so children gain a deep understanding of concepts, proficiency with key skills and the ability to solve complex problems.

Learning Without Tears Children practice letter formation through a variety of multisensory strategies.

Second Step Social Emotional Curriculum Children learn social emotional concepts through puppets, songs and stories.

We listen to and learn about children's understandings of themselves and others.


A healthy sense of self identity helps children to be more open to people from other backgrounds. They are less likely to fear differences.
